Welcome Introduction: Bob Bozzuto welcomed all those in attendance. He asked all members to state their name and group and/or chair position.

November 8, 2017 Minutes: No recommended changes proposed to minutes. Motion made to approve minutes by Paula Sansosti, and seconded by Matt Lawrence. The November minutes were approved.

<u>Treasurer Report:</u> Heather Earle reviewed the treasurer's report. Current balance of 5,300. Treasurer's report will be on file, if anyone wants to review it.

Old Business:

- Toys for Tots 2017 Program: Very Successful. We were able to help a large number of families, we had assistance from Monte Cellos with gift card donations and the fundraisers. Fundraising help from Jimmy Johns and Texas Roadhouse. Thank you to members who shopped, the girls' basketball team and coach for wrapping gifts. Bob discussed that the families are identified by the principals of the schools, are kept anonymous and the families provide a "wish list" of gift ideas.
 - Toys for Tots Chairperson- Need to plan and fundraise all year round. Members asked for job description to seek volunteers from their sports organizations.
 - Rename Program- In order to clarify that program is different from National program, and that it specifically benefits the NA families. The name of "Toys for Tigers" was presented.

 - Discussion regarding the raffle baskets ticket sales. Paula Sansosti suggested we sell raffle tickets to NA community members, who did not buy a NA Kennywood ticket, at a higher price. Discussion about basket raffle being a fundraiser or a thank you and "non NA" members may win baskets.

Membership: Karin Monteparte, Chair passed around the roster and asked members to update information.

<u>Scholar Athlete Awards</u>: Dawn Fischer stated that AD office is working on scholar athlete information and that ALL winter sports should have scholar athlete information for banquet.

Scholarships: Jacki Herring stated that the scholarship applications are online and due in the AD office by April 16, 2018. Please let your players know. Bob Bozzuto stressed that they MUST know what the UBO does. First round of interviews will be April 23rd. Interviews with scholarship committee will be the morning of May 1. Jacki asked for 4 non-senior parents to help with interviews. Krista Colella volunteered to be on interview committee.

Reps Reports:

The following Reports were read by their representative:

Football reported by Krista Colella:

The program includes players Middle School through Varsity. The board includes representatives from each grade, and the meetings are held throughout the season. The team had a successful season. Fees are \$325 per player receive a discount for second player (\$125) Fundraisers are car wash, program sales, and concession. Main income is fee from parents. Boosters provide team meals (pre and post-game), meals for camp, partially fund jackets, senior night, media day, banquet, team gift and senior game jersey.

Boys Soccer report by Paula Sansosti:

North Allegheny Boys' soccer has 5 teams and includes all school soccer players in grades 7-12. Open soccer clinics are available throughout the summer for interested players; tryouts for all teams are in August. Immediately following tryouts, all JV and Varsity players attend overnight training at Family First in Erie, in order to bond and prepare as a team for the upcoming season. All junior high teams (&, 8, 9) begin practices at NA immediately following tryouts. Bobby Vosmaer is the Varsity Head coach, assisted by Carlos Salgado and Lenny Muckle, JV Coach. The 2017 Varsity team, repeating for the second straight year, is the WPIAL Champion,

finishing with a record of 19-2-1. The JV team finished with 11-3-2. The junior high coaches are Alex Gianetti-9th grade, Tom Blackburn-8th grade and DanSmyers-7th grade.

The NA Soccer Boosters Association (NABSBA) is a very involved group of parent volunteers. The 95 players and families of all 5 teams participate in NASBA. We have a great website (eteamz.com/naboyssoccer) that provides detailed information concerning activites, access to schedules, volunteer participation registration, and team expectations. Dues are twofold. 1.) A \$65 financial obligation for all players 2.) Lottery raffle tickets sales. Raffle ticket sales are based on age groups (JV/Varsity -\$70, 9th grade-\$\$%, 8th-\$35 and 7th-\$30) in total 33% of revenue is generated through dues and raffle sales. Senior players pay an additional \$40 to cover "senior extras" and families with multiple players are credited 3 lottery tickets pre extra player. The remaining 67% of revenue is generated through fundraising, car washes, restaurant promotions, spirit wear sales, game day programs, and concession stand. Additional items provided by boosters are bus snacks, senior night pizza, team dinners, senior team dinner, videos, senior posters and end of the season banquet for players and families.

On the philanthropic note, one really dun event is the combined Soccerfest/Pack the Pitch event held at the stadium every fall. It is a great day that promotes NA soccer, allows all soccer teams to support each other, and most importantly gives us the opportunity to support Ambassadors Football Pittsburgh, led by Lenny Muckle. Fundraising Basket sales and bake sales support over 300 players in urban communities. This program allows these kids to participate in academy programs, summer camps travel teams and winter programs, we also collect gently used soccer gear that is repurposed to Ambassador Players.

As with all NA sports, one of the most important accomplishments is the academic success of our players. Of the 63 9-12 grade players, 54 were scholar athletes. We are extremely proud of the players and their focus in the classroom and on the field. We are grateful for the support of the school district, which promotes overall success.
