

THE DR. LAWRENCE BOZZOMO AWARD FOR DISTIGUISHED CAREER ACHIEMENT

Mark Donovan

2021 Recipient

Class of 1984



Entering his 23rd season in the National Football League and his 13th season in Kansas City in 2021, Mark Donovan was named the fifth president in Chiefs history in January 2011 after serving two years as the club's chief operating officer. As president, Donovan is responsible for all aspects of the club's business operations and reports directly to Chairman and CEO Clark Hunt.

Donovan brings unique experience and perspective to the team. He is one of only a few executives league-wide who has worked both at the NFL league office and for a club, with valuable perspective and strong relationships both in the Kansas City area and on a national level. Building on the direction of the Hunt family and Founder Lamar Hunt, Donovan has led the focus on the Chiefs fan experience. The team has emerged as a league leader in fan engagement by introducing technology-based solutions and celebrating the traditions and fan rituals that make GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium special.

That commitment to the fans was on full display in 2020 as the Chiefs worked with the NFL and the City of Kansas City Health Department to develop a detailed, stadium-wide COVID plan to safely host fans in a limited capacity. GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium was one of 21 NFL venues to host fans at any point during the 2020 season and was one of just six stadiums to host fans at all home games in 2020. This resulted in nearly 106,000 fans at regular season Chiefs games, accounting for nearly 9% of the NFL's total regular season attendance (1.2 million). Kansas City was the first NFL team to welcome fans back in-stadium with a pair of exclusive Season Ticket Member practices during training camp. The club then opened the season with fans in the stands for the NFL Kickoff Game in Week 1 and bookended the season as the last non-Super Bowl site to host fans for a game at the AFC Championship Game. After introducing ticketless technology in 2012-13 and expanding to mobile ticketing for the 2015 season, the club moved to an all-digital ticketing platform in 2018 and an allmobile ticketing platform in 2020 to ensure efficiency and security, as well as delivering a contactless entry process for all ticketholders. Fans are able to manage their accounts and tickets from their phones while having access to membership benefits such as exclusive content and a points-based rewards program.

Donovan has consistently focused on expanding the multi-media presence of the Chiefs. Kansas City's awardwinning production group, 65 Toss Power Trap Productions, has continued a trend of content expansion on the Chiefs website, mobile app, social platforms and digital channels. In 2019, the club debuted The Franchise, a multi-episode digital content series taking fans behind the scenes during the team's Super Bowl season. To follow up on The Franchise, the club introduced Kingdom Shorts in 2020, providing fans shorter video snapshots into a number of team initiatives throughout the coronavirus-impacted season.

In addition to connecting Chiefs fans to the team they love, Donovan has overseen a period of tremendous business growth, re-establishing GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium as a popular venue for sports and entertainment. He serves as the President of Arrowhead Events, LLC, the special events arm of the Kansas City Chiefs. Arrowhead Events has seen exponential growth over the past decade,

bringing several major events to Kansas City. The city of Kansas City, along with support from the Chiefs, was awarded the 2023 NFL Draft through a bid process that was announced prior to the 2019 NFL season. In addition, the Chiefs, alongside a number of local business and civic

leaders, are also in the bid process to bring 2026 FIFA World Cup matches to Kansas City, with GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium serving as the proposed match site. The Chiefs have also announced the opening of two fitness

center concepts in partnership with M6 Football. Chiefs Fit will have locations in both the Country Club Plaza and in Overland Park, Kansas, by the start of 2022. In his time in Kansas City, Donovan has also created a new approach to sponsorships, setting a strategy to partner with companies which share the vision, qualities and values of the Kansas City Chiefs. In 2017, the Chiefs were recognized by the Kansas City Business Journal as a Champion of Business for leadership within industry, innovation and commitment to giving back to the community. In 2019 the Chiefs announced a partnership with Government Employees Health Association, Inc. (GEHA) and in 2021, Donovan helped the club expand that partnership and secure the first naming rights agreement in the history of the franchise for GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium.

Locally, the Chiefs continue to be a major economic leader in the Kansas City community. Chiefs games and other events at GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium generate more than \$625 million annually, including \$273 million in household income. They also support nearly 6,000 jobs and provide \$17 million in annual tax revenue for the State of Missouri.

His leadership extends to the community, where he has initiated a more strategic approach to the Chiefs charitable

giving and community involvement, allowing the team to focus resources for greater impact. This approach has identified a handful of causes: feeding the hungry in the region, children's health and wellness initiatives and providing support for families and children in crisis. The Chiefs Charity Game, one of the many Kansas City traditions started by the Hunt family, is the longest-running and most successful charity game in the National Football League.

Donovan and his wife Kathy are also personally committed to the community, serving in numerous civic and charitable leadership roles. He served two terms as the Founding Board Chair for City Year Kansas City beginning in 2016 and remains on the board. For his support of City Year, AmeriCorps and the national service community, Donovan was awarded the Citizen Service Award by Voices for National Service in February of 2019. In the past few years, the couple has chaired the 2020 Angel Gala for The Children's Place, the 2019 City Year Gala as well as Treads and Threads 2019 to benefit The University of Kansas Health System. Donovan served as the keynote speaker for the United WE Champion Breakfast in 2021 as an ally to raise funds and awareness for the advancement of women's economic and civic leadership. Kathy Donovan serves on United WE's Board of Directors. He was also recognized as the 2021 Executive of the Year by the Kansas City Sports Commission, largely for his leadership in safely navigating the organization, the stadium and Chiefs fans through the COVID-impacted 2020 football season.

Donovan arrived in Kansas City after six years with the Philadelphia Eagles as Senior Vice President of Business Operations (2003-08). Prior to joining the Eagles, Donovan held leadership roles as the NFL's Senior Director of Sales and Marketing (1999-2003) and the Director of Sales and Marketing for the National Hockey League (1997-99). He also brings seven years of experience in the private business sector.

The Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, native graduated from Brown University with a double major in political science and organizational behavior/management. He captained the Brown football squad as the team's quarterback and signed with the New York Giants as a free agent upon graduation.

He and his wife, Kathy, have two children and reside in Kansas City.

Gene Modic began his teaching career at North Allegheny during the 1969-70 school year as a student teacher. Gene was employed as a Biology Teacher in 1970 and remained as a biology teacher for thirty eight years, retiring in 2008. While at North Allegheny, Gene coached basketball from 1970 – 1974, track from 1970 – 1983 and was both the Aquatics Director and Coordinator of the North Allegheny Swim Program from 1974 – 1994. He trained over 1,000 lifeguards in our Aquatics Program.

Gene was very active as the Science Department Liaison for over twenty years, was a member of Project Impact for thirty-three years, and member of the Student-Assistance Team. Gene was also the Intermediate High School Athletic Facility Manager for over fifteen years.

Gene is currently entering his fifty-third year employed by the North Allegheny Athletic Department, working as security, press box supervisor, taking tickets, working the scoreboard, or traveling to away games.

Gene was quite active in Athletics, lettering three years in track at Ambridge High School. Gene was a four year letter award winner in track at Indiana University of Pennsylvania.

Gene resides in the North Allegheny School District with his wife, Adele. Gene has three adult children: Paul, a North Allegheny 1995 graduate and Dentist, Greg, a 1998 North Allegheny graduate and Senior Director of Marketing for a biotech oncology company, and Alyssa, a 1999 graduate and Doctor of Pharmacy. Dave was a member of the North Allegheny varsity basketball team from 1984 –1987 lettering all three years. In 1987, Dave was named to the Pittsburgh Press North All-Star Basketball team. Dave continued his academic and basketball career as a scholarship player for Westminster College.

Dave has served as a member of the board for the North Allegheny Basketball Association (NABA) since 2006. Dave has served as the NABA's Executive Board President since 2009. Each year we have over 1,000 boys and girls playing basketball ranging from elementary through secondary school ages. Dave works with our District Head Boys and Girls Basketball coaches to set up players and coaching clinics. NABA offers numerous youth recreational and travel teams.



Jack graduated from North Allegheny in 1960. Jack played varsity football and competed in outdoor track and field for three years; he was also member of the wrestling team for four years. Jack was North Allegheny's first WPIAL Wrestling Champion. Jack's wrestling success assisted our wrestling team to two section titles. Jack continued his academic and athletic career at Slippery Rock and Clarion Universities. While in college, Jack had two undefeated dual meet seasons.

After graduation, Jack coached wrestling at Grove City High School in 1965, then moved to Appalachian State University in 1967. Jack then became a member of the North Allegheny professional staff as a Biology Teacher. In addition to his teaching profession, Jack was an assistant wrestling coach from 1968 – 1978 for Head Coach Gus DeAugustino. Coach DeAugustino and Coach Davis's teams were legendary and quite successful. Many lifelong lessons were taught on the mat and in the wrestling room that led to individual life success.

Jack also coached wrestling at the YMCA, swimming for Royal Ridge and was involved with lifetime sports at North Allegheny as instructor who could certify students in scuba diving. Jack retired from North Allegheny and resides with his wife, Sherry. Jack has two sisters, Durelle Klavon and Lynn Esparza.



Scott Abel Class of 1984

Scott was a standout member of our cross country and track and field teams. Scott letter four years in cross country and three years in track. Scott was elected cross country team captain in 1983. Highlights of Scott's career included a WPIAL Championship in the 800 meter, and he set a North Allegheny record in the 800 meter at the PIAA Championship. Scott won the Pennsylvania Track and Field Coaches Association's State Championship Indoor Mile Event in 1984. WPIAL honors included track relay champions in 1982, runner-up in the WPIAL 800 meter, and third place in the 4 by 800 meter relay.



Our teams were very successful throughout his high school career finishing as the WPIAL Runner-up in 1982 and third in 1983 and 1984. Scott was very successful with big invitationals such as the West Virginia University, Butler and the Pittsburgh Central Invitational meets.

Scott was named as the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette's Student Athlete of the Week. Scott continued his academic and athletic career at the University of Pittsburgh where he continued his athletic greatness. In 1985, Scott finished in third place at the Big East's Indoor Championships in the 4 by 800 meter relay, runner-up in the IC4A Indoor Meet in the 4 by 800 meter relay and was the 4 by 800 meter Big East Champion.

In 1986 while attending the US Naval Academy, Scott took second place in the 4 by 800 at the Millrose Game College and at the Ivy League's Indoor Meet. He also took the silver medal in the 1000 meter at the Ivy League Indoor Meet.

Scott attended Duke University for his post graduate studies and was an honor student in their Fuqua School of Business. Scott is a franchise and small business owner with his company, CertaPro Painters. Previously, Scott held partner level positions at two global consulting firms. Scott takes pride in being a sponsor for Coach Neff's North Allegheny Cross Country and Track Camps.

Scott and wife, Laurie (Phelan) reside in the North Allegheny School District with daughter, Bridget, and son, Greg. Laurie is a 1987 graduate of North Allegheny, Bridget is a senior majorette and Greg is a freshman runner for our cross country and track teams.

Travis Barnes *Class of 1994*

Travis was an extremely talented tri-athlete for the Tigers Football, Basketball and Track & Field programs. He was named as a First Team All-Section Basketball player as well as being selected for the All-Area Team. Travis was the team's leading scorer and rebounder. Heidi was named the Pennsylvania Coach of the Year in 2017, and numerous times as Section Coach of the Year as well as All-WPIAL Coach of the Year.




Jamie Luchini Class of 2012

Kylie was a four year starter at number 1 singles with over fifty individual





In Hershey, the girls' finished 15 points in front of second-place State College. Hannah Lindgren led the way in the state title finishing sixth. Keeley Misutka finished in 11th. Just when you thought the girls' team couldn't get any better, they repeated their performance for 2020 going 6-1 in dual meets and won their third state title in a row. Once again fending off State College, this time by 14 points. With Lindgren gone due to graduation, Misutka picked up the slack finishing in fifth place.



North Allegheny Boys Cross Country (2020)

After coming in third in the 2019 PIAA Championships. The Tigers were determined to get back on top of the PIAA landscape. That's exactly what Coach John Neff's team did, going 7-0 in the regular season and winning two invitationals. They would go onto sweep the WPIAL and PIAA championships winning their 13th state title, and second in three years. In the state championship meet in Hershey, North Allegheny recorded a team score of 49 points finishing 27 points in front of second place finishers La Salle College and Downingtown West. Scott Nalepa finished eighth overall in the state title meet.

North Allegheny Girls Volleyball (2019 & 2020)

In 2019, the dynasty continued for Girls Volleyball as for the fifth straight year, they went undefeated in the regular season. There was a little bump in the road as Coach Heidi Miller's team fell 3-2 in the WPIAL Championship to Canon-McMillan. This loss snapped a 65-match win streak. The Lady Tigers were able to bounce back in the PIAA tournament getting all the way to the final and winning a 5-set thriller against Bishop Shanahan. This was the third straight year the Lady Tigers had defeated Bishop Shanahan in the state title match. In 2020, things were back to "normal" for the Lady Tigers going 18-0 and winning their third WPIAL title in four years and fourth straight state title.



North Allegheny Boys Volleyball (2021)

Coach Dan Schall's boys' volleyball team took down Central Dauphin 3-1 in the PIAA Championship to make it three straight state titles to go along with three straight WPIAL titles. They won the four sets by a score of 27-29, 25-15, 25-14, 25-16 at Penn State University's Rec Hall. It was North Allegheny boy's volleyball's eighth overall PIAA title. The Tigers once again ran the table finishing with a 19-0 record, extending their win streak to 65 matches.

North Allegheny Girls Basketball (2021)

After the 2019-2020 winter season abruptly ended in PIAA Quarterfinals. The Lady Tigers were more motivated than ever going into the 2020-2021 season knowing they were probably the best team in the state a year ago. Coach Spencer Stefko's team left no doubt in 2021 going 26-1 and rolling to WPIAL and PIAA Championships for the first state title in program history. North Allegheny dominated the WPIAL Championship defeating Upper St. Clair by 30 points, 60-30, then handling Spring Ford in the PIAA Championship Game winning 55-40.



North Allegheny Boys Bowling (2021)

The Tigers boys bowling team left little doubt who the best bowlers in Western Pennsylvania were going 10-0 and only dropping 3 games all regular season. The success carried over into the postseason when Coach Bill Jorden's team won their firstever WPIBL Championship. There was some slight adversity at the Western Regional Tournament where the Tigers finished second behind Hempfield but were able to bounce back and win the program's first state championship.

It was another great year for the girls' swimming and diving team as they won their 13th straight WPIAL championship and their first PIAA championship since 1997. In the state championship at Cumberland Valley High School, the girls accumulated 167 points, distancing themselves from second place Wilson by 15 points. Molly Smyers finished second in the 200 individual medley and third in the 500 freestyle. North Allegheny's team of Molly Smyers, Ella Ogden, Isabella Dietz and Lexi Sundgren took third in the 400 free relays.



North Allegheny Girls Swimming & Diving Individual Champions (2020 & 2021) In the 2019-2020 season, Torie Buerger had an exciting race in the 200 individual medleys finishing in a tie for first with Muhlenberg's Cameron Gring to win gold. The Lady Tigers 400 free relay team won state gold as well. The team consisted of Torie Buerger, Lexi Sundgren, Olivia Kisow and Molly Smyers. The group swam the relay in 3:26.54 good for a .4 second win over runner-up Upper Dublin.

In the 2020-2021 season, Christina Shi won the WPIAL and PIAA individual diving championship posting an 11-dive score of 457.50 at the PIAA championships, beating runner-up Abby O'Leary by 32 points. Shi finished fifth in the PIAA diving championships a year ago as a freshman.
