#### Notable items:

There are 52 teams in the WPIBL (Western Pennsylvania Interscholastic Bowling League). They are not divided up by school size but are divided into sections based on location to mitigate travel; matches last 3 hours. The North Section is comprised of NA, Butler, Kiski, Deer Lakes, and Shaler.

The Boys team has also participated in two tournaments this year. In December, they traveled to Ephrata, PA to compete against the best teams in eastern PA. Finishing in the top ten at #7.

Last weekend they traveled to Struthers, OH to compete against the premier teams from Cleveland, Canton, and Youngstown. They qualified 3rd after preliminaries and finished in 4th place during the stepladder finals.

## Inline Hockey (Kathryn Duffy)

We have:

- 2 High School Teams: Varsity 12 players; and Highschool 2 13 players. (We have 9 Seniors.)
- 2 Middle School Teams and 1 Elementary School Team: about 10-12 players each team

#### 2. Are there tryouts?

Yes, our tryouts take place in May, usually over 2-3 days. We typically don't cut players.

3. Provide a summary of the regular season, post-season play, awards, special recognition(s) and any other items of interest.

First, we would like to mention that while Inline Hockey is considered a winter sport, we are really a fall through winter sport as our season starts in the fall. Our games run from September through February, followed by playoffs in March. The final games of our regular season take place this Sunday, February 13th.

Here are a couple of season highlights: As of today (February 9<sup>th</sup>), our Varsity team has a total of 15 wins and 1 loss. In addition, our Middle school 1 team was undefeated through January and only recently lost a couple of games.

Senior recognition was held on Sunday, January 30th at the RMU Arena. Our 9 senior players were recognized.

We would also like to mention that our Inline Hockey program established the Eric Pelly Scholarship to honor Eric's life and his love of hockey. Eric was part of the North Allegheny Inline Hockey program for many years. Sadly, in 2006, Eric's life was cut short from the effects of multiple concussions.

Scholarship Information:

- Each year, a senior NA Inline player is selected to receive a \$1,000 scholarship to help defray the cost of higher education.
- This graduating senior must, have a GPA of 3.0 or higher, played inline hockey for at least 2 years, and plan to attend a two or four year college or technical school. A written application is required which describes how the inline program changed their experience at NA and favorite memories and advice for younger players.

## Athletic Director's Report: Bob Bozzuto

- Spring schedules will change and teams play when weather is dry
- Fall sports schedules has a new 2 year schedule
  - Most varsity sport schedules, with the exception of Football, are complete.
  - Homecoming and Elementary Night is not determined,
- Winter scheduling committee meetings are scheduled for February with tentative approval in late February or early March.
- Spring scheduling committee meetings are scheduled for March with a tentative approval for late March with dates released mid-April.
- Girls/Boys Golf start date will be August 8<sup>th</sup> (same as Football heat acclimation date) all other sports will begin August 15<sup>th</sup> – Middle school will begin August 15<sup>th</sup>-18<sup>th</sup>
- School begins
- 15 day rule that changed during COVID to a 10 day rule will continue for 2022-2023 school year. First games will be Friday the week before Labor Day
  - 5 practices + weekend + 5 practices = play
- June 2022 marks the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Title IX (prevention of all forms of sex discrimination, including discrimination based on gender identity or failure to conform to stereotypical notions of masculinity or femininity)
  - o Celebrations will begin in January 2022
- Spring will begin Girls Flag Football. Pittsburgh Steelers and Philadelphia Eagles have joined in with the NFL and Nike to supply uniforms and funding.
- March 22, 2022 from 6:30-8:00 will be a Strategic Plan Focus Group opportunity for voices to be heard- Brittany will send out the link to signup.
- February 16, 2022 is a free virtual College Recruiting Night with Paul Putnam at 7:00pm Brittany will send the invite

# Round Table & Questions/Answers:

- (Patti McClue)- Message to spring sports that FamilyID site is up and running, but only 50% of students are registered.
  - FamilyID requirements include register (first time users), participation fee or declare hardship, updated physical dated after 6/1/2021, updated baseline testing.
  - Baseline testing dates are scheduled and listed on the Athletics website, no appointment is necessary, just show up to 10 minutes prior to rooms 244-246 at Senior High, This is required for 7, 9 and 11<sup>th</sup> graders regardless of when you took the last baseline test.
- (Patti McClure) Participation Fees have a family cap rates
  - o Interscholastic Sports 3 paid \$75 participation fees, per family. All fees after the 3<sup>rd</sup> one are free.
  - Club Sports (Inline hockey, Ice hockey, Slow Pitch Softball, Rowing, Flag Football and Indoor Track) 3 paid \$25 participation fees, per family. All fees after the 3<sup>rd</sup> one are free.
  - North Allegheny does not receive any money from participation fees. The funds go into a general fund and reduces the contribution that the district pays.
- (Patti McClure) Senior Plaque
  - If a team wants their Senior players recognized on a plaque outside the AD's office, the team will need to provide an 8x10 photo of the Senior with their name (as they want it displayed ex: Patricia versus Patti) on the name plate.
  - At the end of the year, when the Senior comes to pick up their cap and gown, they will also be directed to pick up their Senior plaque.
