





Jonathan Buerger Swimming

Class of 2001



Jonathan was an outstanding swimmer at North Allegheny from 207 to 2010. During his years here, the Tigers won PIAA Championships in 2009 and 2010, as well as four straight WPIAL titles. Jonathan picked up several individual honors, including:

- 2010 Team Captain
- 2010 Champion in the 200 and 500 freestyle
- 2010 PIAA State Swimmer of the Meet
- North Allegheny record holder in the 50, 200 and 500 freestyle
- Member of the 2010 PIAA State Champion 200 freestyle relay team
- WPIAL and North Allegheny record holder in the 200 and 400 freestyle relay teams Jonathan continued his academic and swimming careers at the University of Virginia, where he continued to add to his swimming accolades. His collegiate achievements include:
- Men's Team Captain 2014
- Men's swimming and diving ACC Championship Finalist in the 200, 500, and 1650 freestyle in
 2013
- 2012 USA Swimming Olympic Trials Qualifier in the 200 freestyle
- 2013 and 2014 recipient of the Ramirez Family Leadership Award, given to a swimming team member who exhibits superior leadership ability, high ethics, and excellence in the classroom
- Recipient of the Gus Tebell Memorial Award in 2014, given to the male student-athlete who has maintained the highest accumulative average at the University of Virginia during his four years at the school
- Recipient of the Brooke Maury Memorial Swimming and Diving Award in 2014, given to the athlete who best exemplifies the highest qualities of leadership and unselfish service in the interest of athletics at the University of Virginia

After graduation from Virginia, Jonathan was accepted into medical school at George Washington University, where he will graduate in 2018. His parents are David and Sonya. David is a previous winner of the Hall of Fame's Joseph Drazenovich Award for legendary service. Jonathan has two brothers (Matthew and Zachary) who are both NA swimming alumni, and a sister (Victoria), a current member of the Tigers swimming team.

John Kofmehl

Volleyball

Class of 2004

Josh was the ultimate team player, leading his team to two WPIAL Championships and a PIAA runner up trophy. John was named team captain for two years and was named All WPIAL, WPIAL MVP and All State his junior and senior years. John was a four-year member of NA's Strolling Strings playing the viola for 10 years, member of the National Honor Society and team manager for the girls' volleyball program. John continued his academic and athletic career at D'Youville College in Buffalo, NY where he graduated with



high academic honors with a Doctorate of Physical Therapy. In college, he set records for assists in a season as well as for his career with a total of 4,518 assists. In 2007, John was named DYC Male Scholar Athlete of the Year, and DYC Male Athlete of the Year in 2008. John also earned his college's Medal of Honor given to the most outstanding fourth year student.

John graduated from D'Youville with a Doctorate in Physical Therapy in 2010, and completed the George Washington University/MedStar National Rehabilitation Network Neurologic Residency Program in 2015. He is currently occupied as an inpatient physical therapist at MedStar National Rehabilitation Hospital, treating patients with spinal cord problems, brain injuries, and degenerative neurologic conditions.

John and his wife Bethany currently reside in Washington, DC, where he still plays competitive volleyball, runs marathons, and competes in Ironman competitions.

Josh Hungerman Baseball, Basketball

Class of 2005

Josh was a dominating left handed pitcher for the Tigers with a career record of 19 wins and two losses. He struck out 73 in 75 innings. During his senior year he won 12 of 13 games with a 1.35 ERA as the Tigers won the WPIAL Championship. Josh was named to the All-Conference and All WPIAL teams for two years. Josh was named the PGH Post-Gazette Player of the Year in his senior year. Josh is the leader or among the leaders in numerous NA baseball records such as games pitched, games won, strikeouts, ERA, completed games, etc. Josh was a scholarship player at Cleveland State University where he led the conference in strikeouts (91 in 88 innings) and was also named to the First Team All Horizon



League as a designated hitter. Josh recorded a .345 average with 11 home runs and 50 RBI's. In his junior year in college, Josh was selected in the 50th round by the Colorado Rockies, but decided not to sign and then was selected in the Major League draft again by the Rockies, but in the 17th round. Josh played in the Rockies organization for a number of years before an arm injury sidelined him.

Josh has a Sports Management degree from Cleveland State, and a business degree from Slippery Rock (2015). He is very proud of making the Dean's List for four years, as well as receiving numerous Player/Pitcher of the Week awards during his career. He is currently a baseball instructor as well as a volunteer for the North Park Triathlon.

Josh's parents are Rebecca and David Hungerman.

Erin Huth Blattenberger

Basketball, Volleyball

Class of 1997

Named North Allegheny's Female Athlete of the Year in 1997 Erin was a fierce competitor on both the volleyball and basketball courts. Erin was a four-year player and three-year starter for the basketball team between 1993-94 and 1996-97, helping to lead the Lady Tigers to a 78-32 record over that span, including winning or sharing four Section Three Championships. She averaged 17.8 points and 9.8 rebounds per game in her senior year, making 56 percent of her field goal attempts. Erin scored 1,261 career points. She was twice selected for the Post-Gazette North Region Fabulous Five as well being named one of the PG's Pittsburgh Fabulous Five in 1997.



On the volleyball court, Erin was a three-year starting middle hitter, helping to lead the Lady Tigers to WPIAL Championships in 1994 and 1996, as well as two PIAA titles in 1993 and 1994. She delivered more than 200 attacks at the net and over 130 blocks during her senior year.

After graduating from North Allegheny, Erin continued her academic and athletic careers at Cornell University. After being sidelined by injury during her sophomore year, Erin focused on her academic pursuits, participating in the Cornell Study Abroad program during her junior year.

Erin and her husband Ryan currently live in Devon, Pennsylvania. They are the proud parents of four children, with a fifth on the way. She is currently employed as a Mechanical Circulatory Support Territory Manager for Medtronic.

Kim Markel Masarik Track, Gymnastics

Class of 2003

Kim is one of the most successful track participants in our school's history. Kim earned 13 WPIAL medals and eight PIAA medals between indoor and outdoor track competitions. During her senior year, Kim was the team captain, and qualified in four events at the PIAA Championships. Kim's team won the WPIAL Championship in 01, 02 and 03. Kim specialized in the 100 and 300 meter hurdles, high jump and the 4x4 team relay. Kim has the school record in the 100 and 300 meter hurdles and shuttle hurdle relay. Kim was named



as the Female Athlete of her Class of 2003. Kim was also a member of our outstanding gymnastics team being the silver medalist two times in the silver and bronze divisions and led our gymnastics team to two WPIAL Championships. Kim continued her academic and athletic career at Penn State where she qualified twice for the NCAA Championships in the 400 meter hurdles and the 4x4. Kim was a medalist for the Big 10 Conference three years and her team won one Big 10 Championship. Kim was a United States Track & Field All American and won the team's coaches award three years from 2005 to 2007 during her collegiate career, where she was also an Academic All-American. She was also honored with a Big 10 Sportsmanship Award. Kim also coached at North Allegheny from 2007-2010.

Zach Nanni Volleyball

Class of 2003

Zach was a boys' volleyball standout from 2000-2003, competing at the varsity level in his sophomore, junior, and senior seasons. Zach played for coaches Bob Miller and Dan Schall and was part of an instrumental class that carried on the excellence established by Coach Miller. The 2002 team, on which Zach was a starting outside hitter, advanced to the WPIAL semi-finals. The defeat in the semi-finals propelled the team to an inspired run to the state finals before losing 2-1. Zach would emerge as the dominant WPIAL player in 2003 leading the Tigers to a perfect regular season record, a WPIAL title, and once again to the state final. In addition to match play, the 2003 team won all five of its' tournaments it played in, a feat that is unlikely to be replicated.



Zach earned several individual awards which include 2002 All-WPIAL, 2002 All-State, 2003 WPIAL MVP, 2003 All-State, 2003 – single-most kills in a season at NA (460), a record that has been surpassed since. Zach went on to star as a libero (defensive player) at St. Francis from 2004-2007. At St. Francis, Nanni made his mark in the record book including most digs in a match – 25 (vs. Santa Cruz), 2nd most digs in a match – 23 (vs. George Mason), first and second highest digs in a season – 267 in 2007 and 229 in 2006, most career digs – 804, and 2nd team All-EIVA (East) selection in 2006. The awards and numbers are impressive but the non-statistical information gives it a layer of substance. Zach is 6'0" – very small for a high school outside hitter. Nonetheless he is among the most dominant outside hitters – of any size- at the high school level. He was a competitor. He wanted the ball when the game was on the line. Often, the opponent knew he would get it, and they couldn't do anything about it. He did it all – tough server, an excellent passer and defensive player; an offensive weapon with a cannon of an arm, a fearless competitor. "In North Allegheny's rich volleyball history, Zach is among the elite," stated head coach Dan Schall.

Amy Olshenske Mackle Softball. Basketball

Class of 1989

Amy was a four year starter for our basketball and softball programs. Amy scored 1,072 points in her NA basketball career, was named to the Pittsburgh Press Fabulous Five and was instrumental in our team's success. As a shortstop for the softball team, she was one of the leading hitters in team history with batting averages at or over .500. She was named to the Post-Gazette's North All-Star Team in 1987 and 1989. In 1989, Amy was named female athlete of her class in 1989. Amy played in the First Roundball All



State Classic. Amy continued her career at Clarion University from 19890 to 1991 and started as a freshman. Amy's basketball talents helped Clarion reach the NCAA Division II Elite Eight round, and won the PSAC title.

Amy also played shortstop for Clarion's softball team in 1991 and 1992. She is currently a fifth grade teacher in the Toms River Regional School District, and is a volunteer baseball and basketball coach, a basketball official, and a baseball umpire. Amy and her husband Pearse have two children, Colin (16) and Ryan (14).

Dede Rittman *Golf Coach*

Dede Rittman taught English and Theater in 1979 through 2011 and became our head boy's golf coach in 1979, a position which she held for 33 years. Dede's teams were well prepared and among the team favorites to win the WPIAL title each year. Dede's overall record was 322 victories and 96 defeats. Dede's team won twelve section titles and finished as the WPIAL runner up four times. Dede became a member of the WPIAL Golf Steering Committee in 1980, a position she held for 37 years. Dede's love of theater landed her the position of Director or Asst. Director



for 10 years and won a Gene Kelly award in 1991 for best costume design for My Fair Lady. After retirement, Dede became a very successful author, speaker, and entrepreneur. Dede loves writing and teaching and has many projects planned for the future.

She is currently a rules official with the West Penn Golf Association and the Women's Golf Association of Western Pennsylvania. Dede has volunteered with the USGA at every U.S. Open held at Oakmont Country Club.

Dede and her husband Scott had no children, so all of her students and players became their family. Scott was Dede's biggest supporter, and encouraged her to become the first female coach of a male team.

Kim Steel McGlone

Swimming

Class of 1989

Kim Steel McGlone was a standout swimmer for North Allegheny in 1988 and 1989. She transferred to NA from West Chester Henderson after her sophomore year. Combining both schools, Kim was a four-year district and state championship qualifier in swimming.

Kim won the WPIAL Championship in the 200 and 500 free, as well as numerous honors in the YMCA program, including:

- 1988 YMCA State record holder in the 200 and 500 free
- 1987 YMCA State Champion in the 500 free
- YMCA All-American in the 500, 1000, and 1650 free
- Three-year national qualifier

In addition, Kim received All-State and All-County swimming awards. She also contributed to our 1989 WPIAL Team Championship squad and a third-place finish that year in the PIAA Tournament.

Kim continued her academic and swimming career at Notre Dame. In 1989, she won the 500 free at the Midwestern Collegiate Invitational. She was part of the Notre Dame team that set records in the 400 free relay in 1989 and 1990. Kim earned three varsity letters at Notre Dame, and was and inductee in the Notre Dame Ring of Names.

She graduated Magna Cum Laude from Notre Dame and is a member of the National Honor Society, Spanish Honor Society, Latin Honor Society, and Beta Alpha Psi.

Kim is a CPA, as well as a team mom and team manager in youth sports, including soccer, baseball, field hockey and basketball. She lives with her husband Chris and children Maggie (16), Keely (14) and Max (13).



James Steidel

Soccer

Class of 2001

James Steidel is among the top boys soccer players in NA history. James was a force for all of our opponents throughout his career from 1997 to 2000. He was a three-year starter and letter winner, team captain and played the game with great passion and intensity. James was an attacking midfielder with a team high 17 goals and six assists. Our team excelled during his career such as in his junior year where we won 26 of 27 games with our only loss coming in the PIAA finals to Downingtown. Our team won the section and WPIAL Championship. During his senior year, we had a record of 21 wins, three losses and one tie. We won the



section, finished runner up in the WPIAL finals then in overtime of the PIAA Championship James kicked in the winning goal (his fifth playoff goal that year) for NA's first State Boys Soccer Championship in 2001, when North Allegheny was ranked 16th in the nation. James was one of the most dynamic and well respected players in the WPIAL according to his head coach, legendary Bruno Schwarz. He won numerous awards, including being named All WPIAL, All-State, Regional All-American, and WPIAL Player of the Year. James was also named the Male Athlete of the Class of 2001.

James played collegiate soccer at Carnegie Mellon, where he was a standout performer, earning the University Athletic Association (UAA) Conference Rookie of the Year award in 2001. He was named to three All-Conference teams, two All-Region teams, and was named on of Carnegie Mellon's top 20 all-time players as well as the UAA Conference's Top 50 soccer players of all time. His efforts led Carnegie Mellon to being ranked in the Top 10 for four years, as well as four Conference Championships and four NCAA Playoff appearances between 2001 and 2004. He continued his career at the professional level, playing for the New York Cosmos from 2005 to 2011.

James is currently the Director of Disability Insurance and Senior Vice-President for National Financial Network in New York City. James and his wife Christine (NA Class of 2000) reside in New Jersey with their children Madison, Hudson and Caden and their dog Allegheny (Alley)

Allison Neff Romano Gymnastics

Class of 1991

Allison competed all four years on our All American and Elite All American teams. Allison contributed to three PIAA state titles and one state runner up finish. Allison's teams won four WPIAL team titles from 1998 to 1991. Allison was the team's top floor exercise performer and was the high scorer in the PIAA and WPIAL team competitions. In an individual performance, Allison qualified for the PIAA Championships all four years. Allison held the school record in the floor exercise. Allison earned HS Elite All-American





Boys 200 Medley Relay


Andrew Zhang, Ricky Mihm, Maxwell Gonzalez, Mason Gonzalez
