
North Allegheny Athletic Hall of Fame The Joseph Drazenovich Award for Legendary Service



Dr. Lawrence Butterini 2011 Recipient

Dr. Larry Butterini was a triathlete, a football captain and a Big 33 team member at Avonworth. While attending Muskingham University, Larry played four years of football.

In his 36-years as a career educator, Dr. Butterini has been a teacher, a coach, a counselor, a program director, and a superintendent. He is also a 4-year veteran of the United States Marine Corps. Larry is best known and respected as North Allegheny's distinguished senior high school principal. His outstanding attendance and enthusiastic support of the Tiger athletic program, along with his support for extracurricular activities, is truly legendary.

Danielle Goetz Herring

Swimming

Class of 1997

A four-year letter winner in Tiger swimming, **Danielle Goetz Herring** was a 4-year WPIAL and PIAA qualifier and a 3-year high school All-American. She was a 1995 top-3 finisher in the WPIAL 100-meter breaststroke, finishing 2nd in 1996 and 3rd in 1997. She placed 3rd in the 1997 200 individual medley. Danielle was on the medley relay team that placed all 4 years. In 1997, she was a member of the freestyle relay team. Also in 1997, she was a top-3 finisher competing in the PIAA 200 individual medley along with numerous other high qualifying finishes at States. She set a record in the 100-meter breast-stroke that lasted for 11 years. She captained the 1997 team that set a PIAA team point record that stands to this day.

Danielle was a Division I scholarship swimmer and Student-Athlete at Clemson University. While attending Clemson, she lettered 2 years and had a 3rd place finish at the ACC's in 1997-1998.

Danielle coached a high school swimming team in Charlotte, NC for 2 years. She then moved on to coach at ANSC for a year. She volunteered with the Special Olympics and participated in fund-raising events

Now married to Chris Herring, she is the proud mother of 2 children. She is a special education teacher.



Laurie Harris

Volleyball, Basketball


Class of 1999

Laurie Harris was a three-year starter for both Tiger basketball and volleyball. During her junior year, the volleyball team finished 22-2, 2nd in the WPIAL and 5th in the PIAA. Laurie was 1st Team All-Section and WPIAL and 2nd Team All-PIAA. The next year the team had a 16-2 overall record and landed 5th in the WPIAL. Once again, she earned the above honors, as well as named Section MVP. The Tigers were Section Champions all 4 years. In her high school career, the volleyball team had a 58-5 record. Laurie was nominated All-Section, All-WPIAL and All-PIAA.

In Lady Tiger basketball, the team was 4-year Section Champions – 19-8 her sophomore year, 24-6 her junior year and 25-4 her senior year. The team finished 2nd in the WPIAL all three years. A 1,000 point scorer, Laurie was named All-Section and All-P-G North by the Post-Gazette and the Tribune Review. She earned numerous tournament and media awards.

Laurie then received a full scholarship to continue her basketball career at Northeastern University, where she earned Scholar-Athlete honors.

Laurie has officiated and assisted at YMCA basketball individual/team skill camps & sessions. Laurie Harris is now a client support manager for Nielsen, a market research firm.



Dave Hohman

Basketball, Football, Track, Baseball

Class of 1981

With his 1,371 career points, **Dave Hohman** was the first basketball player in Tiger history to break 1,000 points. He was also the leading Tiger rebounder. The Tigers were conference co-champions in 1978 and made the WPIAL playoffs in 1980. He made Basketball Weekly All-State, Free Press Player of the Year, Post-Gazette All-Star, Player of the Week & Terrific 20, and Street & Smith All Metro Area honorable mention in 1980-81.

Dave's collegiate performance netted him a leadership/teamwork award; he was team captain his senior year. He holds an MBA degree from the University of Chicago. He coaches girls' basketball and fast-pitch softball. He was a 4-year president of the 500-member Naperville, Illinois Softball Association.

Greg Joseph

Soccer

Class of 1981

Greg Joseph played Tiger soccer all 4 years in high school. In 1980, he led the team to the WPIAL playoffs as goalkeeper and team captain. He was nominated WPIAL All-Star and received All-State recognition that year. Overall, the Tigers were 21-10-3. Greg had 16 shutouts.

In 1982 at Indiana University of PA, Greg went on to lead the soccer team to a 12-3 record, a #9 ranking in NCAA Division II. He played on the All-Western PA Intercollegiate Soccer Conference team and was an All-American that year.

Greg served as Assistant Soccer Coach at IUP in 1984. He is a member of "The Clarks" – a legendary Pittsburgh rock band. The band has participated in a fundraising concert for the North Allegheny Band and Chorus.




Joe Koury

Soccer, Basketball

Class of 1979

A 4-year Tiger soccer goalkeeper, **Joe Koury** was a 3-year starter and team caption in his senior year. In his junior year, he was named to the WPIAL Soccer All-Star team, leading the Tigers to three straight section titles, three WPIAL finals and two WPIAL Championships. His career record was 51-8-5, with 31 shutouts. Joe gave up only 33 goals during his entire career.

Joe went on to start 89 consecutive games at Bowling Green University where he holds both season and career shutout records, and the career record for saves. He captained his team to one of the best single-season performances in Bowling Green history. He graduated with a 3.48 GPA and was named to the All-Ohio Academic Team. After graduation, Joe became head coach for women's soccer at Bowling Green. He has also coached boys' and girls' youth soccer.



Mark Schweers

Football, Wrestling

Class of 1971

Mark Schweers played football and wrestled all 4 years at North Allegheny. He was recognized All-Conference and All-State in football his junior year. He was a 2-year letterman, a special teams captain in 1970, and team captain in 1971.

As a wrestler, Mark was undefeated in dual matches in his senior year. That same year, the Tigers were Section and District champions. Mark was team captain and was voted the Most Valuable Student-Athlete by North Allegheny coaches in 1971.

While attending Washington & Jefferson College, he was on the 1975 PAC championship team and ranked 8th overall out of all D-III wrestling programs. He was nominated MVP in wrestling, track and cross-country that year.

After college, he became head wrestling coach at Highland High School in Sparta, Ohio in 1978. In 2003, he became assistant middle school wrestling coach at the Pine-Richland School District. Mark has run in numerous road races, including 6 marathons. He has served as community soccer and softball coach, Special Olympics volunteer, and advisor to the Best Buddies Program at Pine-Richland.



Kimberly Scott Franks


Golf, Swimming

Kim Scott Franks was a four-year member of the Lady Tigers Golf Team. This outstanding team was WPIAL Champions all four years. While attending high school at North Allegheny, she actively contributed her time by teaching Special Olympic swimming lessons and coaching YMCA kinder-soccer.

Kim went on to participate all four years on Campbell University's golf team. She received her law degree from the Wake Forest University School of Law and currently practices law in the Securities and Corporate Finance Department.

Cory Sullivan

Baseball, Soccer

Class of 1997

In **Cory Sullivan's** senior year on the North Allegheny baseball team, he batted .460. In 1996, he helped the Tigers advance to the PIAA championship.

Cory was the Tigers' leading scorer in soccer. One of the best strikers in the WPIAL, he led the NA soccer team to the League Championship as well as the PIAA finals. He served as team captain and received numerous scholarship offers from Division I soccer programs. He was a 3-year All-WPIAL Soccer All-Star, and received All-State and Regional All-American recognitions in his senior year, along with USA Today honorable mention All-American status.

Cory went to Cypress JC in California where he was named Team MVP and earned All-Orange Empire Conference honors in 1998-1999. Cory was Junior College All-American in 1999. He then transferred to Wake Forest and was named to the All ACC Second Team.

Cory was then drafted by the Colorado Rockies in the 7th round of the 2001 Major League Baseball amateur draft. He has played 476 games as a professional, with a 6-year batting average of .271. He has played for the Rockies, the Mets and the Astros. He has 300 Major League hits and is currently listed as a free agent.



Matt Woffington

Tennis

Class of 1993

Matt Woffington has upheld the Woffington tennis tradition quite capably. He was a WPIAL two-time doubles champion and in 1992 finished 3rd place in the PIAA. He continues to hold North Allegheny tennis records for the most wins (62), the longest dual match streak (43), and the highest career winning percentage (over 92.5%). Matt had undefeated junior and senior year seasons and lettered all four years. He received the YMCA Scholar-Athlete Award.

Due in large part to Matt's performance, the Tigers had 4 final-four finishes along with being WPIAL finalists in 1992 and WPIAL Champions in 1993.

While attending Grove City College, Matt was a member of three Presidents' Athletic Conference Championship teams. He was named the PAC Conference MVP for three years. Once again, he set a school record for winning percentage at 92.5%. He also received the North Hills News-Record Outstanding Citizen Award.

Matt served as North Allegheny Assistant Men's Coach in 2000 and 2001 as the Tigers captured WPIAL titles both years. Beginning in 2002 to the present, he has coached the North Hills High School men's and women's tennis teams. He was the Assistant Teaching Professional at the Edgeworth Club from 1996-2002.



Kim Wyland-Krul

Gymnastics

Class of 1988

A 4-year letter earner in gymnastics, **Kim Wyland-Krul** was a key contributor to all four WPIAL Championship teams while attending North Allegheny. As a senior, Kim was nominated the team captain. The Tiger gymnastic team became the PIAA Champions in her senior year. Individually, her awards are many in the WPIAL. Among them, she earned three 1st place finishes and a 2nd place in vault; a 2nd, two 3rds, along with a 4th in floor; a 1st, two 5th place finishes plus a 6th in bars; a 1st, two 3rds and a 5th in beam; and, two championship 2nd place finishes with a 6th in all-around. Kim was a PIAA vault champion in 1985. In 1986, Kim was the All-Around WPIAL Champion.

She went on to attend Clarion University where she became a cheerleader for the football, basketball and wrestling teams. She graduated summa cum laude with a degree in elementary education.

Kim taught kindergarten & 1st grade in the Allegheny Valley School District for 7 years. She was a 6th grade teacher at Ingomar Middle School for one year. She was Assistant Coach of the NA Varsity Gymnastics Team during the 1992-1993 season. She has volunteered as a coach, teaching gymnastics to children in kindergarten and grades 1-3. Kim currently coaches at Jewart's. She and her husband Kevin have two children - McKenna (a Level 7 gymnast at Jewart's) and Brandon.
