Randy Gore is the webmaster for the North Allegheny athletics website and "The Voice" of the North Allegheny Tigers, broadcasting an array of sporting events for NA since the fall of 2010. Gore is a broadcast veteran, who has spent over 12 years broadcasting minor league baseball for the West Virginia Black Bears (Pittsburgh Pirates Class A Short-Season Affiliate) and the Washington Wild Things. Annually, Gore is a member of the broadcast crew for the Pony League World Series on WJPA Radio in Washington, PA. Additionally, Gore spent 7 seasons as "The Voice" of Saint Vincent College football on WCNS Radio in Latrobe, PA. While with the Wild Things, Gore was twice named the Frontier League's Broadcaster of the Year and was also recognized by the minor league circuit with the Commissioner's Award of Excellence.

Gore has been recognized with 12 Pennsylvania Associated Press Broadcasters Association awards. Of the 12 AP Awards, eight took 1st place honors in various news and sports categories. Gore is also the owner of the PAC Sports Network which video streams athletics in the Presidents' Athletic Conference. The PAC Sports Network also broadcasts Carnegie Mellon University athletic in the University Athletic Association. CMU is one of the top NCAA Division III programs in the nation.

Gore is a proud alumnus of McKeesport High School and Waynesburg University. His family includes his wife, Kristen, and his dog, Hank.



## **Jerry Aufman**

2023 Recipient

Jerry Aufman has spent most of his adult life in fifth grade – teaching students at Franklin Elementary and then McKnight Elementary. Jerry loved teaching students and took great pride in seeing the excitement his students had when they mastered a new math skill or advanced to the next level in reading. His favorite subjects to teach were social studies and math. After 36 years of teaching at North Allegheny School District, he retired in 1997.



Jerry had a creative approach to acquaint the fifth-grade students with the work of Charles Dickens. Each year, he read the Dicken's "The Christmas Carol" to his students. He and the students would then put on the book as a play as part of their holiday festivities. The students were familiar with all the characters and the story line from reading the novel. They then spent time practicing their assigned roles, learning about teamwork, the arts, and the satisfaction of having created a successful production.

Jerry was active within local professional organizations and served as president of the North Allegheny Education Association.

As much as Jerry loved the academic side of teaching and he also loved helping students develop a passion for sports. He was often seen on the sidelines coaching football, baseball, and basketball. He often joined the kids at recess playing sports alongside the students.

In 1973, Jerry ran for and won an election to serve as Commissioner of McCandless Township, and Councilman for the Town of McCandless. He was re-elected to the position 11 consecutive times and retired in 2017 after 44 years in office. Jerry served in many roles during his tenure, including 34 years as vice president of Council and 2 years as president. Throughout his years on the Town Council, he helped secure grants and acquire recreational property. He was an early adopter of storm water management policies and worked to rebuild and upgrade over 30 miles of Town roads. He was appointed as the Town of McCandless representative to the North Hills Council of Government and served as its president.

Early in his tenure as a Councilman, Jerry was the key creator of the Town Joint Recreation Board and the Summer Recreation Program, a cooperative effort between McCandless, Franklin Park Borough, Marshall Township and Bradford Woods with support from the North Allegheny School District. The Summer Recreation Program was a very popular program among parents and kids alike, that provided a structured program of arts, crafts and sports for four weeks of the summer.

Another initiative that Jerry was instrumental in starting for the Town of McCandless was the annual Community Day. First held in 2001, McCandless Community Day has been an annual event that includes food trucks, games and rides, entertainment, booths for local groups, basket raffles, and a parade and fireworks, featuring the North Allegheny Marching Band. When Jerry retired from Council in 2017, the Town recognized his service with the dedication of Aufman Lane. Jerry also volunteered with the Ingomar Volunteer Fire Company. He served as the president for 30 years and, while no longer active in fighting fires, he still attends Fire Company functions when possible. During his tenure as president, he oversaw the purchase of two properties as well as the construction of the Substation on Route 19 in Wexford. In retirement, Jerry volunteers at The Heritage Center which was built to house and display Joe Bullick's collection of local history artifacts.

Jerry and his wife, Beverly, have four children, thirteen grandchildren and thirteen great-grandchildren with one more on the way. They currently reside in McCandless.








Andrew Siminerio
2023 Recipient



Andy began his coaching career with North Allegheny Boys' Lacrosse in 1991. In 2004, he did double duty as a volunteer varsity assistant girls' lacrosse coach. Andy assisted in creating and organizing the North Allegheny Lacrosse Association and was the association's first president from 1995 – 1999. Andy's dedication to the sport included collaborating with parents' groups to start the North Allegheny Boys' Middle School and Girls' Lacrosse programs.

Andy's involvement in the sport of lacrosse began in 1968. He attended Lynbrook High School in Lynbrook, New York. He was named to Nassau County Division Five Boys' Lacrosse All-Section team in 1970. Andy was also a member of his high school football team. He received a scholar-athlete scholarship in 1970. Andy attended Cornell University and played for four years from 1971 – 1974. He received All-Ivy League Honorable Mention status in 1973 and 1974. Andy continued to play lacrosse from 1977 – 1994 as a member of the Pittsburgh Lacrosse Club. He was named to the Midwest Cities Lacrosse Conference All-Star team during his post-collegiate playing days. Andy would later become a member of the Pittsburgh Lacrosse Club's Board of Directors.

In 1988, he was an assistant coach of Western Pennsylvania's Boys' Middle School team and participated in the 1988 World Lacrosse Championships. Andy was inducted into the Pittsburgh Lacrosse Foundation Chapter of U.S. Lacrosse in June 2001.

Andy retired from Vitro Glass and PPG Industries, Inc. as Senior Legal Counsel of Intellectual Property. Andy's family includes wife, Linda, and children John (North Allegheny Class of 1999), Drew (North Allegheny Class of 2002) and Lara (North Allegheny Class of 2005).






#### **Kevin McCarthy**

Kevin's overall pitching record was seventeen wins and one loss. He had a career batting average of .418. In the 1993 WPIAL Baseball tournament, Kevin threw a

Lindsay was the starting goalie for the North Allegheny Tigers for forty-three games in her high school career. Lindsay was an extremely talented goalie with an average goals against at two per game. Lindsay was a multi-year letter winner. She was a four-year member of the Athletic Director's All-Academic team. Lindsay's efforts opened the doors for other women interested in the sport of ice hockey.



Upon graduating from North Allegheny in 2010, Lindsay began her Division I collegiate women's hockey career at Dartmouth College. During her time with the Big Green, she was a four-year starting goaltender and had the honor of co-captaining the team during her senior year. They reached the ECAC finals and qualified for the NCAA tournament (Elite 8) during her freshman campaign. She finished her college career ranked Number 1 in program history in games played and saves. She ended her tenure tied for third all-time in wins and fourth in career goals against average and save percentage. The team awarded her Rookie MVP her freshman year, Defensive MVP each of her four seasons, and Team MVP for her final campaign. She was the recipient of the 1948 Scholar-Athlete Award, presented to an athlete (one male, one female) in the Dartmouth junior class who exemplifies excellence in both academics and athletics.

Lindsay majored in Biology and Psychology at Dartmouth, graduating cum laude in 2014. She enjoyed the mountains of New Hampshire so much that she remained there for nearly a decade, ultimately graduating from Dartmouth Medical School in 2021. She now lives in Connecticut with her wife, three kids under three and two dogs, pursuing her internal medicine residency with dream of working in addiction medicine.

#### **Matthew Gray**


Soccer

National Championships. Erin was a four-year letter winner for her contributions to rowing. Erin continued her academic and athletic career at Dartmouth where she participated in Fall 2007 through Spring 2011. She participated and placed second in the NCAA Division I Rowing Championships in the Women's Varsity Eight Plus and in 2011, participated in the NCAA Championships in the Women's Varsity Four Plus. Erin's other achievements include finishing in second place in the E.A.W.R.C. Sprints and Varsity Eight Plus.

Erin is employed as a Research and Development Engineer at Los Alamos National Laboratory. Academic and Educational achievements include receiving her Bachelor of Arts in engineering and mathematics, and a minor in astronomy from Dartmouth College and Optical Engineering. In 2013, Erin received her Master's Degree in Civil and Environmental Engineering from Carnegie Mellon University. Kayla was a two-time All-American swimmer, and three-time consecutive WPIAL Champion in the 100 Butterfly. In 2015, she won a PIAA gold medal, along with her teammates, winning the 200 Medley Relay. Individually, she has held the 100 Butterfly record since 2013, as well as sharing records in the 200 Medley and 400 Freestyle Relays. Kayla's contributions helped North Allegheny win four consecutive WPIAL titles and three consecutive PIAA Runner-Up finishes.

Kayla continued her academic and athletic career at the University of Kentucky. While at Kentucky, she was a four-year point scorer in the Southeastern Conference (SEC) Championships. Kayla was a B-Finalist in the 200 Butterfly and 200 Backstroke in 2019. Kayla was named to the First-Year SEC Honor Roll in 2016 and SEC Winter Academic Honor Roll from 2017 to 2019. She was named College Swim Coaches Association of America (CSCAA) All-American Honorable Mention in 2016, 2018 and in 2019. She was inducted into the Frank G. Hall Society of Character in 2018. This award is presented to athletes at the University of Kentucky who show commitment to academic excellence, athletic participation, personal development, community service and career preparation. Kayla earned the team's scholarship award in 2017. Kayla qualified and competed in the 200-Meter Backstroke at the 2016 Olympic Trials.

Kayla's significant contribution to the University of Kentucky Swimming and Diving program helped Kentucky place third in the SEC in 2017 and 2019. The Women's Swimming and Diving Team won "Women's Team of the Year in 2017, and Academic Team of the Year in 2018 and 2019. She is currently employed at Children's Hospital of Pittsburgh as a Pediatric Neurosurgery Physician's Assistant.

Kayla's family includes parents Karl and Dianne, stepmother Marion and siblings, Neil, Kyle, Meredith, Kelsey, and their loving spouses.

Garrett Larkin
Football / Track & Field

Class of 2007



Garrett was a two-sport athlete competing in football and track and field from 2004 – 2007. In 2007, Garrett broke the long-standing North Allegheny Shot

Put record. His achievements are plentiful with a seventh-place finish at U.S. Nationals, PIAA finishes in seventh place in 2005, fifth place in 2006, and third place in 2007. Garrett was invited to the Penn Relay Carnival where he finished in fifth place in 2006 and 2007. Garret was a four-year letter winner for Throwing Coach Mike Hambrick and Head Coach John Neff. Garrett's contributions helped the North Allegheny Track and Field team win the WPIAL Team Championship in all four years of his high school participation.

Garrett attended the University of Pittsburgh on a Track and Field Scholarship and earned academic honors. While at Pitt, he was an eight-time Big East Qualifier (Shotput) and two-time a Big East Qualifier in indoor weight throw. Other personal accolades include being a two-time Big East Qualifier in the hammer throw, eight-time IC4A Qualifier (Shotput), four-year varsity letter winner and two-year team captain under Head Coach Alonzo Webb. Garrett currently ranks second all-time in the outdoor shotput and sixth in the indoor shotput and indoor weight throw.

In 2012-2014, Garrett was the Head Throws Coach for North Allegheny Track and Field where he coached multiple state qualifiers, including his brother, Matt, who placed fifth at the PIAA Championships. Garrett has coached eighteen years for Head Coach John Neff's youth track and field camp.

Garrett believes in helping his community by building playgrounds in under-privileged neighborhoods in the Pittsburgh area and has volunteered with Big Brothers and Big Sisters while part of Pitt's Track and Field Team.

He is a Population Control Manager for the Fifth Judicial District of Pennsylvania (Allegheny Country Courts). Garret has been married to his beautiful wife, Megan, for seven years and has two wonderful sons: Carter, age six, and Luke, age 3. His family includes a strong family support system, and a crazy "Track Mom."

This evening is extra special since his induction is alongside his coach and mentor, Mike Hambrick. Garret, his family and the Track and Field Community is here to celebrate Mike's outstanding accomplishments in coaching thousands of young men and women to success. The Hambrick's have welcomed Garrett into their family as their own and he will forever be grateful for their love and support.

### **Shirley Hirth Dunham**

Rifle

Class of 1976

Shirley Hirth Dunham was a four-year standout shooter for Coach David McDonald from 1972-1976. Rifle was North Allegheny's and the WPIAL's only co-ed sport during that time. Shirley was a four-year letter winner and named a team captain her senior year.



Beginning her freshman year with no shooting experience, she had the determination and persistence to develop the skills, ability, and mental discipline to perform exceptionally well. In regular season matches, she qualified to participate and shot in 69 of the 73 total rifle matches during her four years. After the first match of her sophomore year, she shot in every match that followed. She also shot in all four WPIAL Championship matches.

Shirley was a strong contributor to the team's exemplary success during those years with an overall 63-10 team match record. In 1975 – 1976, the team set a season record for going 10-0 in Section. The team finished as Section Champions all four years and received two bronze and two silver finishes in the WPIAL.

In her junior year, she received awards for Highest Section Match Average and Top NA Shooter. Her senior year awards included Top Season Average, Team 10X Champion, Top Season Match Average, and Top NA Shooter. Also in her senior year, she participated with a teammate in the WPIAL All-Star Shoot, and they finished in fourth place. In the WPIAL All-Star competition, Shirley received the award for the Highest Score for all female shooters.

Graduating in 1980 from the University of Pittsburgh and receiving a Bachelor of Science Degree in Nursing, she was a Dean's List Scholar and inducted into Sigma Theta Tau – The National Honor Society of Nursing. Rifle competition and the nursing program was not compatible, nursing won that match. Shirley spent many years in various nursing positions around the country and as far away as Germany. While in Germany, she worked as a Department of the Army civilian managing a clinic/emergency room in a remote location supporting soldiers and their families.

Shirley has retired from Nursing and livers with her husband John in Northern Virginia. John is a retired Army Officer who is now working for a Defense Contractor. They have one daughter, Dr. Chelsey Dunham, who pitched all four years in college for Yale's Division I Softball Team and later earned her Ph.D. in Biomedical Engineering.

Shirley's induction into the Athletic Hall of Fame has astounding significance as she represents hundreds of student-athletes who participated and competed with pride for the North Allegheny Rifle Program, especially since the program no longer exists and there is minimal overall team history that has been retained.

#### **Jake Woodley**



Mike McMahon became the starting quarterback during his senior year in 1996. While at North Allegheny, he was featured in an NFL Films Presents episode as the next premier quarterback to originate from Western Pennsylvania. After his varsity career, Mike received full scholarships from multiple FBS schools. Soon after, Mike verbally committed to





Mike attended Rutgers in 1997 and started as a true freshman. He was a four-year starter and left the Scarlet Knights as the all-time leader in passing. Mike was selected and played in two collegiate all-star games, The Blue-Gray Football Classic and the Senior Bowl. Mike was selected as the Most Valuable Player of the Blue-Gray Football Classic. He was selected by the Detroit Lions in the fifth round (149th overall) in the 2001 NFL Draft by trading up with the New England Patriots, giving up the 6th and 7th round draft picks. Mike was the first quarterback drafted into the NFL from Rutgers University.

In his rookie season, and in only his second NFL start, he led the Lions to their first victory of the season against the Minnesota Vikings. Mike played four years for the Lions from 2001-2004. In 2005, he became an unrestricted free agent and signed with the Philadelphia Eagles. On December 24, 2005, he became the first Eagles quarterback to rush for two touchdowns in a single game since Randall Cunningham in 1992. In 2006, Mike signed with the Minnesota Vikings. The following year, Mike pursued his passion for football and played one more year in the Canadian Football League, as well as an additional three years in the UFL, completing a ten-year professional playing career in 2012.

In 2013 Mike transitioned to coaching and served as the Offensive Coordinator and Quarterbacks Coach at Pace University. In one year, he was able to develop a true freshman to earn a selection to the All-Conference team; the team's only selection. The following year, Mike returned home to the Pittsburgh area and was the Offensive Coordinator and QB Coach at Fox Chapel High School. The Foxes set a single season record for total points and total yards. Fox Chapel qualified for the WPIAL Playoffs after an eighteen-year drought. In 2015, Mike returned to Rutgers to finish his college degree. Mike took a role in TV broadcasting with Fox 53/22 The Point as an analyst in 2019. Last season, Mike served as the Pass Game Coordinator for Pine-Richland High School, the 5A state champions.



Mike currently lives in Wexford, and privately trains quarterbacks all over the country.

#### **North Allegheny Girls Cross Country**

It was another dominating 2022 for Coach John Neff's girls cross-country team as they won another WPIAL title and their eighth state championship. This state championship was the NA girls fifth in a row. In Hershey, the Lady Tigers wasted no time getting to the lead taking a 26-point lead by the end of the first mile. By the halfway point the NA girls led by 52 points and ultimately beat the second place finisher by 58 points. Wren Kucler placed third overall and was the best finisher for the Tigers. Eva Kynaston finished in ninth-place and Erin McGeory had a 23rd place finish.



#### **North Allegheny Boys Cross Country**

The NA boys' cross country team continued their dominant run in 2022 winning their third state championship in a row and fourth in five years. In the state championship meet in Hershey, North Allegheny was in sixth place at the 1-mile mark. In the next 900 meters, the Tigers went from sixth to a 12-point lead. From there the Tigers rolled to the state title with an 85-point performance compared to 161 points from the runner-up. This was one of the largest margins of victory in recent history. Jack Bertram led the way with a third place finish. Seniors Gregory Kossuth and Jackson Pajak finished up strong careers with Kossuth coming in 20th place and Pajak finishing in 25th place.

#### North Allegheny Girls Volleyball

In 2022, Coach Russ Hoburg's team did not drop a set in the regular season, they kept that streak going into the postseason until they were tripped up by Pine-Richland in the WPIAL Championship falling in five sets. The Tigers would get their revenge in the state semifinals when they beat Pine-Richland in four sets before winning their sixth straight state title by taking down Garnet Valley by scores of 26-28, 26-24, 25-8 and 25-12. Six straight state championships is the second longest streak in state history behind Norwin who won nine straight state titles from 1976-1984. In the match, Mia Tuman led the way with 14 kills, 12 digs and 41 assists. Ella Zimmer had 11 kills while Ella Deeter and Carissa Treser each had 10 kills. Caroline Curran had 25 digs on defense while Deeter had 14. Deeter and Zimmer each had six blocks for the Tigers.





#### North Allegheny Girls Swimming & Diving

It was another great year for the girls' swimming and diving team as they won their 15th straight WPIAL championship and their eighth PIAA championship. In the state championship at Bucknell University, the girls accumulated 194 points, finishing 18 points ahead of second-place Hatboro-Horsham. Christina Shi took first place for the third consecutive year in the diving portion of the state championship, Lola Malarky finished in third place and Juliet Hood had a seventh place finish. The 200 Medley Relay quartet of Greta Mott, Natlie Sens, Eva Ogden and Rebecca Melanson finished in fourth place. Lexi Sundgren took fifth in the 200 free and the 200 Free Relay team of Sundgren, Melanson, Sens and Clair Bacu finished in sixth place. North Allegheny had a 20 points lead over state college heading into Day 2.

On Day 2, Sundgren finished third in the 500 Free, Natalie Sens got third place in the 100 Breaststroke and the combo of Sundgre, Eva Ogden, Greta Mott and Claire Bacu came in eighth-place in the 400 Free Relay.



#### **Christina Shi (Diving)**

Christina Shi won her third consecutive PIAA Class AAA diving championship at Bucknell University. She totaled a score of 264.45 and became the first WPIAL diver since Chartiers Valley's Maria Lohman (2013-2015) to win three straight Class AAA state diving titles.

Leyna Rumpler became the first state champion in North Allegheny girls' wrestling history in 2023 going a perfect 4-0 at the state tournament with four consecutive wins by fall, including a fall over Katelyn Coldren of Carlisle for the 148 pound title. Rumpler tied for seventh place as a freshman and had a runner-up finish last season. This season, her junior year, she finally was able to capture the state championship.



#### **INLINE HOCKEY**

After falling in the PIRHL Championship in the 2021-2022 season. The North Allegheny Inline Hockey team got their revenge dominating the regular season winning their first 17 regular season games. The Tigers would get tripped up in the regular season finale losing to Seneca Valley 4-3 in overtime. Wouldn't take North Allegheny long to get revenge on the Raiders as they faced off with them in the PIRHL Semifinals and showed the regular season loss was a fluke as they defeated the Raiders 6-1. North Allegheny would face off against Penn-Trafford in the championship and win the championship series two games to zero with wins of 8-4 and 5-4 to take home the PIRHL Championship. The Tigers finished a great season with a 20-1 record and outscored their opponents 151-41.







