Since September of 2001 Richert has hosted the KDKA Radio Morning News. Larry Richert has been a constant in Pittsburgh radio and television since the early '80s. He has long been an ambassador for the city of Pittsburgh and was winner of the Vector's Richard Caliguiri Award for that reason.

Born in Millvale and raised in McCandless Township, Richert attended North Allegheny High School and graduated from Clarion University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Communications.

Larry originally came to KDKA in November of 1988 and has worked in both TV and Radio ever since including a ten-year stint as a weather anchor with sister station KDKA-TV – CBS Affiliate.

Richert is the voice of NFL Films/Steelers Highlights, narrating his first film in 1985 and now he is the Public Address announcer at Acrisure Stadium for the Steelers. Plus, he joined the Pitt Panthers Football Network Broadcast team where he hosts the pre-game show and reports from the sidelines plus post-game locker room.

Larry also co-wrote and co-produced a feature family film in worldwide distribution called "Amazing Racer" starring Lou Gossett Jr, Charles Durning, Eric Roberts, Jason Gedrick, Daryl Hanna, Scott Eastwood and many more. He also co-produced and narrated the "Bruno Sammartino" Documentary. Larry was also the narrative voice of the New York Yankees "Behind The Seams".

Larry is involved many charity organizations including "Larry's Heroes" recognizing ordinary people doing extraordinary things and support our Veterans.

He is a Trustee on the Board of Independence Health System and Chair of the Butler Health System Foundation.

In addition, he also is the Honorary Chairperson for the McGuire Memorial annual Celebrity Golf Classic and the JDRF event plus the HM3 Independence Fund Charities as well as numerous philanthropic efforts.

Randy Gore is the webmaster for the North Allegheny athletics website and “The Voice” of the North Allegheny Tigers, broadcasting an array of sporting events for NA since the fall of 2010. Gore is a broadcast veteran, who has spent over 12 years broadcasting minor league baseball for the West Virginia Black Bears (Pittsburgh Pirates Class A Short-Season Affiliate) and the Washington Wild Things. Annually, Gore is a member of the broadcast crew for the Pony League World Series on WJPA Radio in Washington, PA. Additionally, Gore spent 7 seasons as “The Voice” of Saint Vincent College football on WCNS Radio in Latrobe, PA. While with the Wild Things, Gore was twice named the Frontier League’s Broadcaster of the Year and was also recognized by the minor league circuit with the Commissioner’s Award of Excellence.

Gore has been recognized with 12 Pennsylvania Associated Press Broadcasters Association awards. Of the 12 AP Awards, eight took 1st place honors in various news and sports categories. Gore is also the owner of the PAC Sports Network which video streams athletics in the Presidents’ Athletic Conference. The PAC Sports Network also broadcasts Carnegie Mellon University athletic in the University Athletic Association. CMU is one of the top NCAA Division III programs in the nation.

Gore is a proud alumnus of McKeesport High School and Waynesburg University. His family includes his wife, Kristen, and his dog, Hank.

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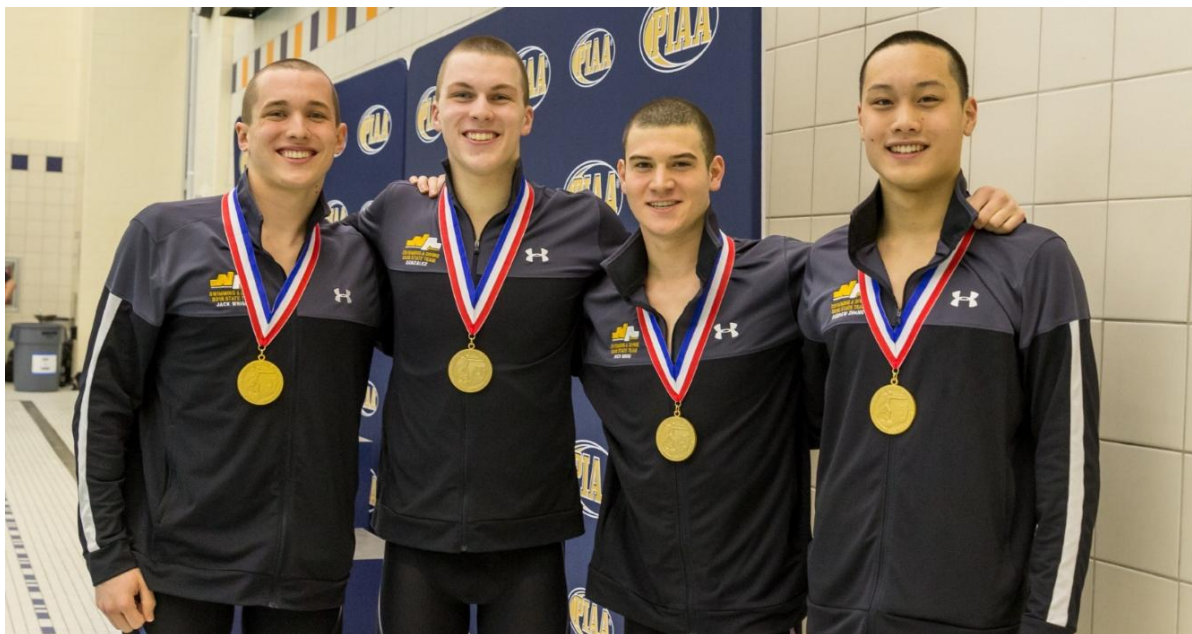
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The NA Swimming and Diving Boosters Association wishes to congratulate all the 2025 NA Hall of Fame inductees.

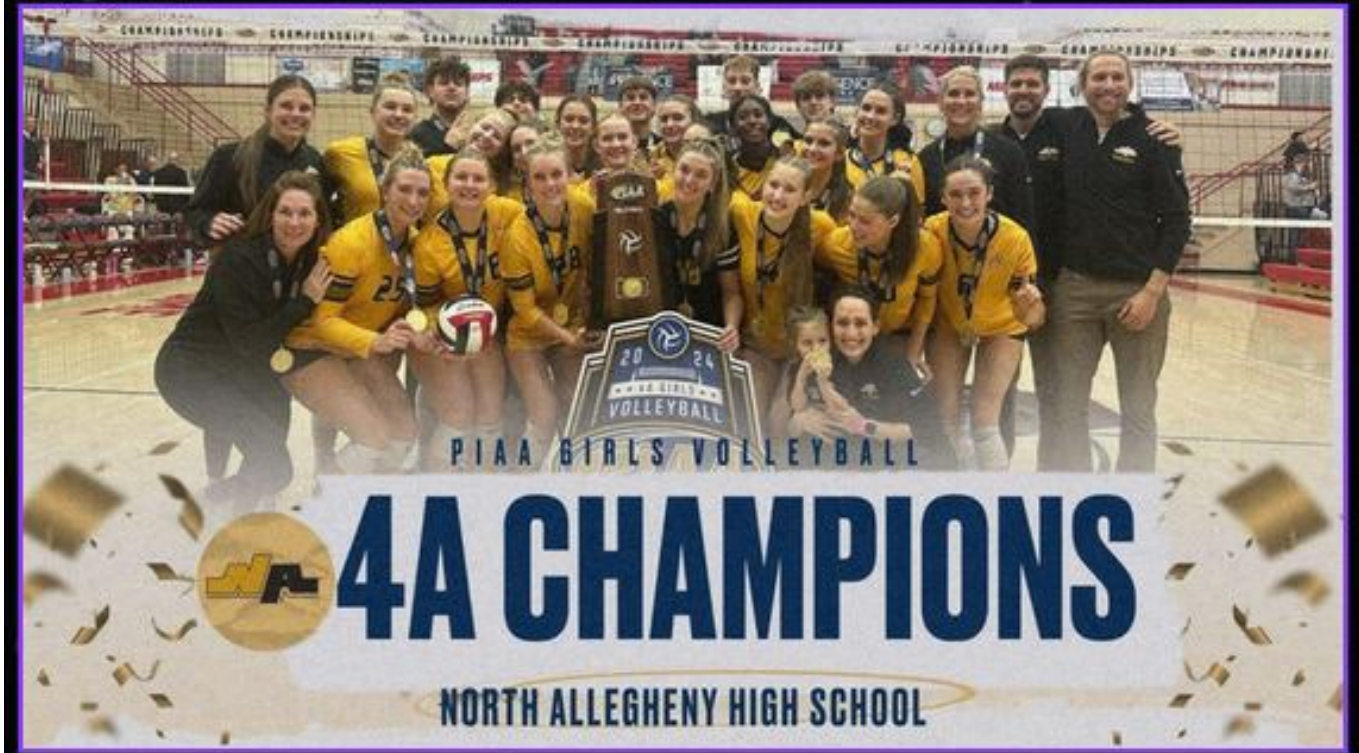

Abby Miller

Volleyball

Class of 2020

Abby Miller is a distinguished North Allegheny High School graduate from the Class of 2020, known for her exceptional achievements on and off the volleyball court. Abby's high school volleyball career spanned from Fall 2016 through Fall 2019, during which she played a pivotal role in one of the most dominant programs in Pennsylvania history. As a member of the team that won the first three PIAA state championships of its current winning streak, Abby contributed to an astonishing combined team record of 86-3, including two WPIAL championships.



Individually, Abby earned starting roles early, beginning as the JV setter and varsity team member her freshman year, before becoming a varsity setter/hitter for her final three years. She was a three-time First Team All-State, All-WPIAL, and All-Section selection. Her outstanding talent was nationally recognized in 2018 when she was named Pennsylvania Gatorade Girls' Volleyball Player of the Year and the Pittsburgh Post-Gazette Player of the Year. Abby also excelled outside high school, competing on elite club teams nationally and earning AAU All-American honors.

Continuing her volleyball journey, Abby attended Cleveland State University on an athletic scholarship, where she started as the setter for her freshman and sophomore years and earned a spot on the Horizon League All-Freshman team. Despite setbacks due to concussions in her junior and senior years, she concluded her career with impressive statistics, including 152 kills, 1,545 assists, 48 service aces, and 408 digs. Abby then utilized her fifth year of eligibility at Mercyhurst University, joining her sister Paige and helping the program transition to Division I status. She finished strong with 76 kills, 154 assists, 16 service aces, and 105 digs while pursuing a Master's degree in Organizational Leadership, earning a 3.95 GPA.

Off the court, Abby earned a Bachelor of Science in Music Therapy and completed a six-month internship at University Hospitals Cleveland Medical Center. She passed her board certification and worked in a music therapy clinic providing services to hospitals and children with special needs. After completing her graduate degree, Abby returned to Pittsburgh and currently serves as a board-certified music therapist at the Hope Learning Center, supporting K-12 students with special needs and learning disabilities through both group and individual therapy sessions.

Throughout her college years, Abby committed to community service, volunteering regularly with food banks, shelters, and local schools in Cleveland and Erie.

Abby comes from a family deeply rooted in athletic excellence and service to North Allegheny. Her father, Dr. Brian Miller, is a celebrated North Allegheny and Penn State athlete and a National Champion at PSU, now serving as superintendent of Pine Richland School District. Her mother, Heidi Miller, was a standout volleyball player at Penn State and served as North Allegheny's varsity volleyball coach for nine years. Abby's sister, Paige Miller, was a key contributor to North Allegheny's four consecutive state championships and played collegiately at Mercyhurst. Abby's grandfather also left a lasting legacy at North Allegheny through decades of coaching and teaching.

The Miller family's tradition of excellence and commitment to North Allegheny continues to inspire future generations.

Jeff Alexander

Wrestling

Class of 1990



Jeff Alexander's remarkable wrestling career at North Allegheny High School is highlighted by a collection of team and individual achievements that solidified his legacy in the program's history. During his high school years, Jeff was a member of teams that dominated at every level, earning 4 Section Championships, 3 WPIAL Championships, and an impressive 4 PIAA State Championships. Notably, his team broke the PIAA scoring record four times and captured the National Championship in the 1987-88 season, followed by a National Runner-Up finish the following year.

As an individual competitor, Jeff was a 3-time Freestyle State Champion, Cadet National Champion in 1988, and Junior National Runner-Up in 1989. He was twice a Section Champion, twice a WPIAL Runner-Up, and twice a PIAA Runner-Up. Demonstrating outstanding leadership, Jeff served as captain of the 1990 State Championship team and earned titles such as Cal St. Champion and Tool City Champion.

Jeff's wrestling excellence continued at the collegiate level, where he earned a scholarship to the University of Illinois and competed at 118 lbs. Following his competitive career, Jeff contributed to the North Allegheny wrestling program as an assistant coach under Coach Kyriazis during the formative years of the program's resurgence.

Currently, Jeff works as a Territory Manager for RC Bremer Marketing, covering New York, Pennsylvania, Ohio, and West Virginia. Family plays a central role in his life; he and his wife, Meg Alexander—a North Allegheny Hall of Fame inductee for women's gymnastics—have four children who all attended North Allegheny. His son Brandon participated in marching band and pole vaulted on the Track and Field team, daughter Madeline was also in marching band, and Charlie was a dedicated ROTC cadet.

Jeff Alexander's legacy is one of athletic excellence, leadership, and enduring commitment to the North Allegheny community.

Michelle Weniger

Michelle Weniger was a proud varsity cheerleader at North Allegheny High School from 1974 to 1976, during which time her team earned first-place honors for three consecutive years. Coaching the North Allegheny Girls Tennis program, Michelle has earned 5 PIAA State Championship along with 6 WPIAL Championships, leaving a total record of 354 wins, 52 losses, and 1 tie. Her passion for athletics and leadership continued beyond high school, culminating in her recognition as the 2017 United States Tennis Association Middle States High School Coach of the Year, as well as the Middle States Allegheny Mountain District High School Coach of the Year.

Michelle and her husband, Frederick, have four children—Julie, Fred, Michael, and Christina—and are proud grandparents to ten grandchildren: Paige, Michael, Lauren, Molly, Fred, Faith, Michael, Luca, Cillian, and Cameron.

Her dedication to both her family and coaching continues to impact the community and inspire young athletes.

Joe Wirth

Volleyball, Baseball

Class of 1979



Joe Wirth was a two-sport standout at North Allegheny, excelling in boys volleyball from 1975 to 1979 and baseball from 1978 to 1979. His impact on the volleyball program helped lay the foundation for one of the school's most successful athletic traditions.

A three-year co-captain of the boys volleyball team, Joe was instrumental in leading the 1978 squad to a 20-5 record and a WPIAL runner-up finish. In 1979, his senior season, North Allegheny posted an outstanding 29-2 record, capturing both the WPIAL Championship and the school's first-ever PIAA State Championship in boys volleyball. Joe was a two-time All-Section All-Star, earned numerous all-tournament honors, and still holds the school record for most second-serve aces in a single season (73).

Following his high school success, Joe attended George Mason University, where he was a four-year letterman on the men's volleyball team from 1980 to 1984. His collegiate career culminated in a historic 1984 season, when George Mason reached the NCAA Final Four and achieved its highest national finish in program history—#3 in the nation.

Joe's passion for volleyball extended into coaching. He served as an assistant coach at George Mason in 1986, helping the team finish with an impressive 27-5 record, and returned as a volunteer assistant coach in 2023, a role he continues today. He also coached at the high school level, serving as assistant coach at Woodbridge High School (VA) from 2009 to 2019.

In addition to volleyball, Joe has made a significant impact in his community through youth sports. He coached Woodbridge Little League Baseball from 1996 to 2015 and was inducted into the Woodbridge Little League Hall of Fame in 2024. Since 1998, he has been a coach, board member, and treasurer for the Eastern Prince William Basketball Association, serving youth in northern Virginia for over 25 years.

Professionally, Joe enjoyed a long career as a Regional Sales Manager for the National Checking Company, covering a 10-state region from New York to South Carolina from 1986 until his retirement in 2020.

Joe resides in Woodbridge, Virginia, with his wife, Lisa. He is the proud father of two sons: Joseph, a 2012 graduate of James Madison University, and Brian, a 2015 graduate of Limestone College who earned his master's degree from Arkansas State in 2021.

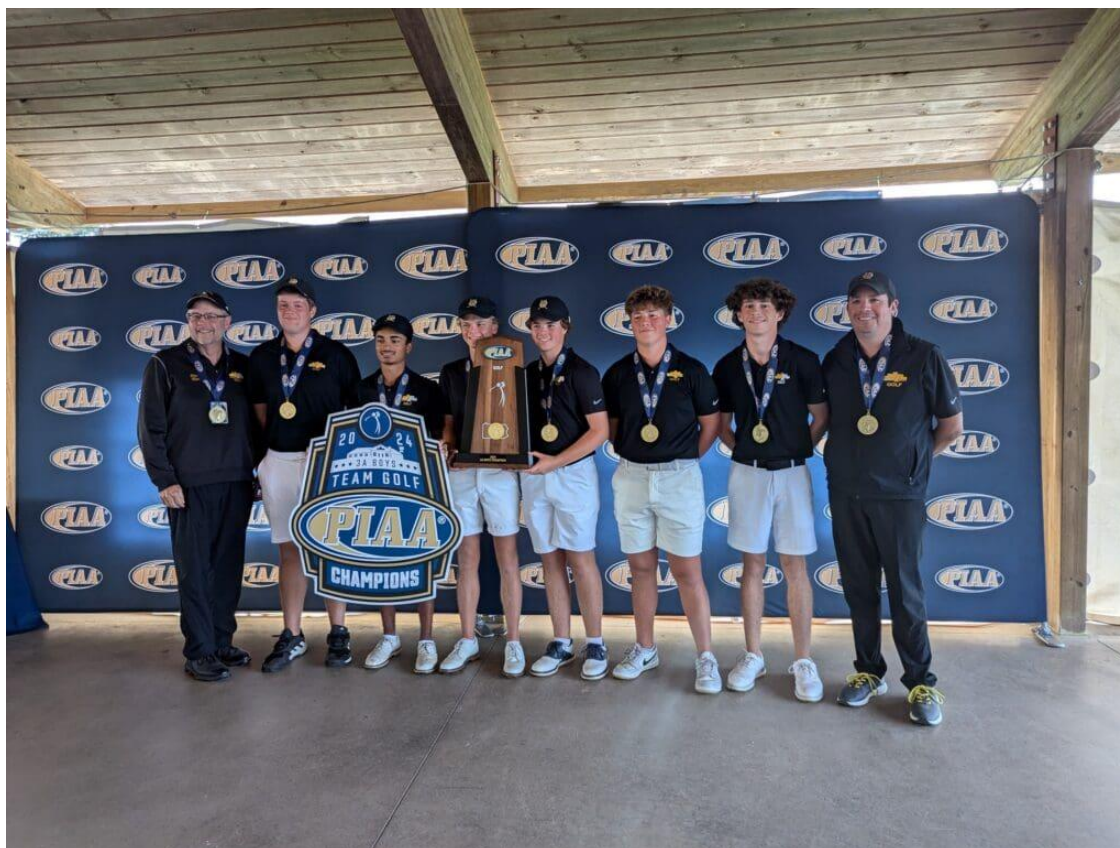

The 2024 North Allegheny boys golf team turned in one of the greatest seasons in school history claiming their 2nd ever WPIAL Championship and 1st since 1971. The Tigers also claimed their 1st state championship in program history.

It was straight business for NA out of the gate winning their first 7 matches. The Tigers were tripped up by South Fayette, losing by 1 stroke in non-section play. The only other loss all season was to Butler in a playoff.

North Allegheny came in 2nd place at the WPIAL Team Semifinals but that was good enough to get to the WPIAL Team Championships for the 2nd straight season. In the WPIAL Team Champions, NA would shoot 3 shots better than South Fayette to claim gold.

In the state team championship, the Tigers shot 2-under par and defeated South Fayette once again, this time by 4 strokes, to claim the state title.

BOB AUSTEN AWARD FOR DISTINGUISHED COACHING SERVICE

Don Heckenstaller *2025 Recipient*



Don Heckenstaller has made an indelible mark on the North Allegheny rowing program through his 13 years of dedicated coaching from 1994 to 2006. When Don began coaching the North Allegheny Rowing Team in 1994, the team consisted of just 15 rowers. Under his leadership, the program experienced remarkable growth, expanding to 90 athletes and establishing itself as a competitive force in scholastic rowing. So significant was the team's growth that tryouts became necessary to maintain manageable numbers.

Don served as head coach of the boys team from 1994 to 1996 before transitioning to lead the girls team from 1997 through 2006. His tenure was marked by extraordinary success, including capturing the total points trophy at the 2001 Midwest Scholastic Championships—a prestigious event featuring 48 high schools across eight states. Over the years, his athletes earned an impressive eight gold medals at national championship events, along with numerous silver and bronze medals, showcasing the program's sustained excellence.

A crowning achievement came in 2006 when three North Allegheny female rowers, joined by a teammate from Chartiers High School, triumphed at the USRowing Junior Trials in Princeton, New Jersey. Their victory in the quad event earned them the honor of representing the United States at the Junior World Championships in Amsterdam, Netherlands.

Don's own rowing career began at the Florida Institute of Technology, where his Freshman Eight boat won gold at the prestigious Dad Vail Regatta. After a hiatus, he returned to rowing in his 30s, capturing multiple Master National Championship medals before dedicating himself to coaching at North Allegheny.

Alongside his coaching achievements, Don enjoyed a 35-year career as a systems programmer with Equibank and Giant Eagle. Now retired and residing in Sarasota, Florida, Don continues to embrace his passion for rowing, embodying a lifelong commitment to the sport.

North Allegheny proudly recognizes Don Heckenstaller's exceptional contributions to its rowing program and his enduring legacy of excellence, leadership, and growth.

BOB AUSTEN AWARD FOR DISTINGUISHED COACHING SERVICE

Melissa Titus Watts *2025 Recipient*



Melissa (Titus) Watts dedicated over a decade to the growth and success of the North Allegheny Rowing Team, serving in various coaching roles from 1996 to 2006. She began her coaching journey as an assistant and novice coach for both the boys' and girls' teams (1996–1999), before stepping into the role of head coach for the boys' team from 2000 through 2006. A proud 1991 graduate of North Allegheny, Melissa first joined the NA Rowing Team in the fall of 1988, when the program operated as a Lifetime Activity out of a trailer on Herr's Island (now Washington's Landing). She rowed for three years with NA and continued her passion for the sport as a coxswain on the Syracuse University Women's Rowing Team.

After college, Melissa returned to Pittsburgh and was quickly drawn back to the river—and to her alma mater. She joined a dedicated team of coaches who worked closely with parent volunteers and the North Allegheny Athletics Office to transition rowing from a Lifetime Activity to a full Club Sport. During this pivotal time, they secured daily bus transportation for athletes, relocated practices from the Allegheny River to the safer back channel of the Ohio River across from Neville Island, and expanded team infrastructure as the program grew.

Under her leadership and in collaboration with her fellow coaches, the team achieved multiple podium finishes at major regattas including the Midwest Scholastic Rowing Championships, Stotesbury Cup Regatta, and USRowing Youth Invitational. One of the highlights of her coaching career was leading the team to win the overall points trophy at the 2001 Midwest Scholastic Championships.

For Melissa, the most rewarding part of coaching was watching her athletes grow and develop through their dedication to the sport—and seeing the lasting friendships formed among the rowers and their families.

Melissa now lives in Phoenix, Arizona, with her husband Nigel, daughters Hannah and Maddy, and their dog Teddy. She is a co-owner of two yoga studios and is an enthusiastic dance mom—although she still wishes one of her daughters had at least tried rowing!

Gabrielle Smychynsky White

Soccer

Class of 2016



Gabrielle Smychynsky distinguished herself as a standout soccer player during her time at North Allegheny High School, earning four varsity letters and contributing significantly to her team's success. A two-time Section Champion, Gabrielle was recognized as an All-WPIAL and All-Section player throughout her high school career. She was a four-year scholar-athlete who showcased her clutch ability by scoring six game-winning goals.

Continuing her athletic career at Coastal Carolina University, Gabrielle competed at the NCAA Division I level in the Sun Belt Conference from 2016 to 2019. She was a consistent starter, logging 3,256 minutes over four years and serving as the team's sole captain during her senior season. Gabrielle earned a place on the Sun Belt Commissioner's List every year of her collegiate career and maintained an impressive 4.05 GPA, securing a spot on the President's List from freshman through senior year. As a defender, she scored three goals, including a memorable game-winner against Troy University.

Off the field, Gabrielle has demonstrated a strong commitment to her community and youth sports. She has coached for COAST FA Soccer Club (2020–2024) and Kinder Kick It youth soccer program (2021–2023), and volunteered with the Miracle League of Myrtle Beach and The Grand Strand. Her leadership and dedication were recognized when she was named Rookie Teacher of the Year for the 2021–2022 school year in Horry County. Gabrielle was also selected for the Leadership Grand Strand Class 46, a program of the Myrtle Beach Area Chamber of Commerce, and was honored as one of the Best and Brightest “30 Under 35” by Grand Strand Business Magazine.

Currently, Gabrielle works as an Account Executive for Coastal Outdoor Advertising, where she continues to apply her leadership skills in a professional setting.

Gabrielle is supported by her family—her parents Leslie and John Smychynsky, sister Lexie Smychynsky, and her husband Wes White.

Dave DeGregorio

Basketball Coach

Coach



For nearly four decades, Dave DeGregorio dedicated his life to the game of basketball and the student-athletes he coached. A master motivator, strategist, and mentor, Coach DeGregorio built a career marked by excellence, integrity, and a passion for helping young people grow both on and off the court.

Over 38 years of coaching, DeGregorio achieved historic milestones that few in Western Pennsylvania high school basketball can match. He reached the prestigious 500 career wins mark while guiding his teams to multiple section championships and memorable postseason runs. His leadership brought national recognition, earning him the titles of PIAA AAAA State Coach of the Year in 2010 and PIAA AA State Coach of the Year in 2020. Under his direction, his teams advanced to the PIAA AAAA State Semifinals in 2010 and consistently competed among the best in the state.

At North Allegheny (2004–2016), DeGregorio compiled a remarkable 232–76 record, capturing five section titles and cementing the Tigers as perennial contenders. His overall career coaching record stands at an impressive 273–125, a testament to his consistency and competitiveness across decades. Beyond high school, DeGregorio also served as a Graduate Assistant Coach at NCAA Division I James Madison University, further broadening his impact on the game.

Always committed to service and community, DeGregorio organized the WPIAL Challenge and helped raise over \$60,000 for the Greater Pittsburgh Food Bank during the COVID-19 pandemic, showcasing his belief that athletics can be a powerful force for good.

Today, Coach DeGregorio is retired and enjoys time with his family—his wife Amy and their sons Jackson, Eli, Isaac, and Owen. His Hall of Fame career is defined not only by wins and championships, but by the countless players whose lives he touched, preparing them for success far beyond the basketball court.

The 2024 season saw the North Allegheny girls volleyball team win their 6th WPIAL Championship in 8 seasons and 8th consecutive state championship. The 8 straight state titles ties the state-record for most consecutive state championships in girls volleyball set by Norwin who won 8 in a row from 1976-1983.

The regular season was business as usual for the Tigers as they won their first 14 matches. They had some scares in that win streak, especially from September 24 to October 3 where they went 5 sets in 3 of 4 matches but won them all. NA would drop the final match of the regular season to finish with a 14-1 record.

In the WPIAL playoffs, North Allegheny swept Armstrong before beating Upper St. Clair in 5 sets and North Catholic in 4 sets to claim WPIAL gold.

The PIAA playoffs were much smoother for the Tigers as they swept Manheim Township and Landisville Hempfield and beat Bishop Shanahan and Spring-Ford in 4 sets to claim their 8th straight state title.

During her high school years, Abby played on the girls' basketball team from 2012 to 2016, helping lead her team to multiple championships and earning numerous individual honors. Highlights of her high school career include contributing to the AAAA Section 3 Championships (2013-2014, 2015-2016), a WPIAL Championship appearance, and a deep run to the PIAA Semi-Finals in 2015-2016. She was also a vital part of the Wright Automotive Tip Off Tournament Championship team in 2015-2016.

Individually, Abby made a significant impact as the team's leading scorer during her rookie season and was selected twice for the AAAA All Section 1st Team. As a key member of the North Allegheny cross country team, Ryan helped lead the team to multiple WPIAL championships and a PIAA State Team Championship in 2010, along with top finishes in national-level competitions such as the Nike Cross Nationals and Footlocker National Cross Country Championships. Individually, he was the 2010 PIAA State Cross Country Champion and the 2009 WPIAL Cross Country Champion. Ryan also set the North Allegheny school record in the 3,200m with a time of 9:03.

It was another very successful year for the North Allegheny swimming & diving program as the boys won their 11th WPIAL title in the last 14 seasons and their first state title since 2019 and 7th overall.

At the state championship meet, the Tigers posted 215 points, 53 points ahead of runner-up LaSalle College.

The lone individual state champion was the 200-yard Freestyle Relay.

Danny Lesinski took the bronze medal in the 200-yard IM while claiming silver in the 100-yard backstroke. Gus Miller came in third in the 100-yard butterfly and the 100-yard backstroke. The 400-yard freestyle relay team also claimed state silver. Ethan Maravich came in third in the diving portion.

The North Allegheny 200-yard Freestyle Relay team was the lone individual champion for the Boys' Swimming & Diving team at the PIAA Championships.

The relay team consisted of Grant Regule, Gus Miller, Mason Shantz and Zachary Totin.

At the WPIAL Championships, the relay team took home gold with a time of 1:23.01.

The Tigers dominated the events at the PIAA Championships putting together an even better time of 1:22.50, winning the event by 1.2 seconds.

Mike McKnight is a proud graduate of North Allegheny High School, Class of 1991, and a standout athlete known for his contributions to both the football and baseball programs. During his high school years, Mike was a five-time letter winner who played varsity football from 1988 to 1990 and varsity baseball from 1990 to 1991.

Mike played an integral role on the 1990 football team that won both the WPIAL and PIAA State Championships—the first football state title for North Allegheny—finishing ranked #13 nationally by USA Today. That same year, the baseball team secured the school's first WPIAL Championship, and in 1991, the baseball team repeated as WPIAL champions and finished as PIAA State runners-up, earning a #20 national ranking by USA Today.

Individually, Mike started every game as a sophomore defensive back in football and contributed as a running back, rushing for 1,130 yards and 15 touchdowns in 1990. He earned 2nd-Team All-WPIAL honors as a defensive back in 1989 and as a running back in 1990. On the baseball field, he was a 1st Team All-Area All-Star at second base, batting over .400 and ranking highly in home runs, doubles, and hits. Mike also earned selections to the All-WPIAL Baseball Team and North/East All-American All-Star Team in 1991. At the time of graduation, he held the North Allegheny record for most career football games started with 39.

Mike continued his athletic career at Mercyhurst College, playing baseball from 1992 to 1995. As a scholarship athlete, he started every game during his four years, helping the team achieve a 108-42 record, two NCAA playoff appearances, and consistent national top-20 rankings, including a high of #12. He earned two Honorable Mention All-American honors during his collegiate career.

Beyond his playing days, Mike has remained actively involved in youth sports, serving as the team manager for his daughter's NRFA and NCFC youth girls soccer teams over the past four years.

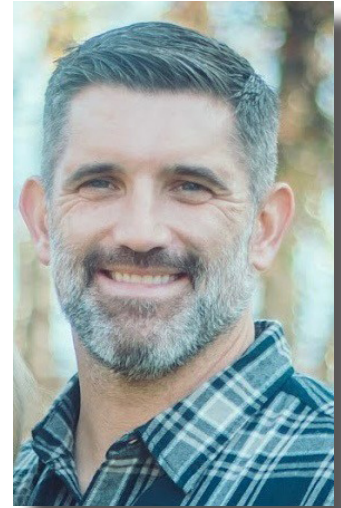

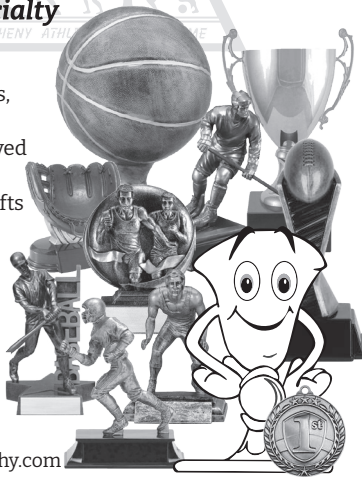

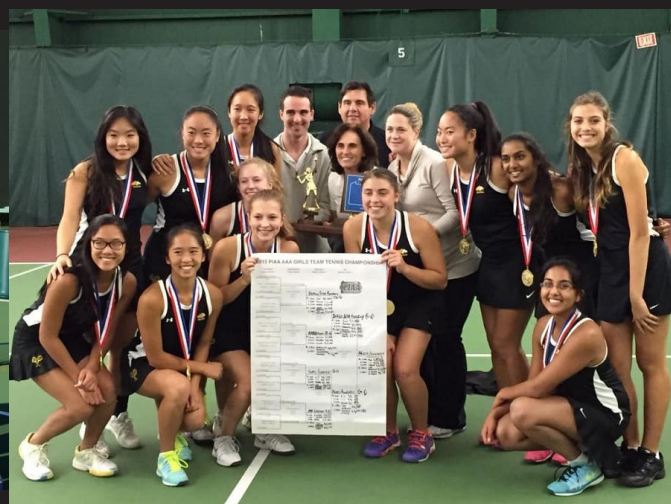
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
